John 10:1-10

Heritage Snippet 2: Did you know... that the long history of Parramatta Mission contains many, wonderful mothers who personified the phrase:" grace under pressure"? Among those, was Parramatta-born Mary Cover Lawry (nee Hassall) (1799 - 1825). While still in her early 20s, Mary helped to create the first church on this site and sailed across half the world doing important missionary work with her husband, Rev. Walter Lawry. While being the daughter, sister and wife of influential men, Mary was very influential in her own right. She led our first Sunday School and devoted her life to others. Sadly however, she died in England, aged just 26 - soon after giving birth to the couple's second child, a daughter called 'Mary Australia'. It is certainly fitting - as we celebrate Mothers' Day 2014 and look forward to our Ladies High Tea next weekend - that we stop to remember young Mary Lawry. Not only did she set the benchmark for the love and service displayed by our subsequent female leaders - she did so with undeniable courage.

Keith Hamilton's placement as the Leigh Memorial Minister will conclude, and he will continue as the Senior Minister/Group CEO.

The Church Council this week confirmed the names of members of the Westmead Joint Nominating Committee to work towards calling a new Minister of the Word for Westmead, which will allow Veitinia to transition to focussing all her attention on the role of Minister of the Word of the Leigh Fijian Congregation. The Church Council has begun work on this process.

Reflections

I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly. John 10:9-10

In the book, Inclusion: making room for grace, Eric Law wrote:

I have heard this passage used by many Christians to support their exclusion of others. Their assumption is that if a person does not believe in the specific way that they do, that person is blocked from entering God's kingdom by Christ, who is the gate. The image of Christ that they use is that of a doorman, checking each person who is attempting to come in, and only those who fit the prototype – themselves - and follow the rules are allowed to enter. This interpretation of Christ as the gate is based on the assumption of limited grace - there is not enough grace to go around, so only those who are good enough will receive it.

On the contrary, Jesus was describing a much more dynamic process, using the symbol of the gate –"come in and go out and find pasture." This dynamic process is based on the spirituality of abundance "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." The way Jesus used the gate image connoted Christ as a gracious host, welcoming strangers to come in and share the abundance of love, joy, and life and sending guests out into the world to share the same. If Christ is the gate, then Christ is the boundary function of the Christian community.

On this reading, it is a distortion of the Christian faith to exclude people. The idea of inclusion is central to the Uniting Church, even expressed in its name. Of course, even people with good intentions and good will can inadvertently find ways to exclude. We can do that by who do and don't talk to. Who we do or do not sit next to at functions? Do we pay greater attention to a speaker of a certain gender, race, age, or political persuasion than to others?

Another way of understanding the Easter message is of God embracing the whole of creation. Somehow when we stop setting limits and go for grace and go inclusion, our life becomes bigger and abundant.
