Luke 11:1-13

1 And when he was in a certain place praying, as he ceased, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples".

2 And he said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, let your name be sacred

Let your kingdom come

3 Give us our bread for the coming day.

4 And forgive us our sins for indeed we ourselves forgive

all who are obligated to us

And lead us not into temptation".

5 And he said to them, "Can any of you imagine having a friend and going to him at midnight and saying, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread 6 since a friend of mine has arrived from a journey and I do not have what I may set before him' 7 And the one inside answering, says 'Do not cause me trouble, the door is now shut and my children are with me in bed. I cannot arise and give you anything'? 8 I tell you, even if he will not arise and give to him because he is a friend, yet because of his avoidance of shame he will get up and give to him as much as he needs. 9 And I say to you, Ask, and it shall be given to you; Seek, and you shall find; Knock, and the door shall be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks will find and to the one who knocks it shall be opened. 11 What Father among you, if his son asks for bread will give him a stone; or a fish, will instead of a fish hand him a snake; 12 or if he asks for an egg will hand him a scorpion? 13 Now if you being evil know good gifts to give your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those asking him. *(Translation by Keith Hamilton)*

Reflections

The Hebrew and Christian scriptures are set in societies in which honour and shame were prominent cultural mores and taboos that set expectations of interpersonal relationships and personal behaviour. Honour and shame was not always used for the good of all. By contrast, God was seen as honourable and could be trusted. The teaching about prayer from Luke, that includes a version of the Lord's Prayer is more about God's honour been kept, than a mechanism for humans to get what they wanted. God is honourable and will keep promises. The tale of the village neighbour arriving at midnight wanting some bread for a visitor is about honour and shame. In the society of Jesus it is ridiculous to consider that the householder would not jump up and provide the bread immediately. Not to do so would be to bring shame on the house and, by extension, the whole village for not providing the appropriate hospitality. It is a joke that makes an important point. Just as it is unimaginable not to provide the hospitality, so to it is unimaginable for God not to be honourable, and to be ready to answer prayer.

This is not a call to persistence in praying for a matter until we get the answer we want, but consistently praying in the knowledge that God always hears and always acts. Here is another reminder that God is not remote and aloof, but near and attentive.

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Violence and tragedy again fill our news. We are quick to point the finger at certain religions. The uncomfortable truth is that while the founder of Christianity preached peace, he was violently killed, and many of his followers have been the most violent. The Emperor Constantine became a Christian because he believed that God had delivered him victory in battle. Here is part of a confronting article by Rev Graham Long Senior Pastor / CEO of Wayside:

Christian Emperors such as Charlemagne sent out his soldiers into the world to offer people a choice of baptism or death. Long after Rome had collapsed and the Christian centre of the world was in the East, in modern Turkey, it wasn't the marauding Muslims who destroyed the Christian centre but the marauding Christians. Those same blood-thirsty Christians were the aggressors in the series of persecutions against Muslims that we call 'the Crusades'.

In our recent past, we, the Christian West, invaded Iraq. Two hundred and fifty thousand people protested by marching through Sydney. Millions protested around the world but it made no difference. The Christian West demonized Saddam Hussein as if he was worse than Robert Mugabe or any other tyrant. We demonized him as if he had anything to do with 9/11. Nearly two hundred thousand Iraqi civilians died. Double that number were injured. Millions were made homeless and for what? How are the people of Iraq enjoying the "freedom" of the Christian West? This pointless exercise cost nearly five thousand American lives and who knows how many suicides of veterans in the USA. It was a war that made a few Christian leaders fabulously rich and the majority of Christian tax payers burdened with debt for generations to come.

I want to say what should have been said in 2001, if we'd have had any politicians who were real leaders. "My God, we should talk to these people". Can you blame Muslim people and countries for feeling threatened, not heard and desperate? We should talk to these people. Our feelings are raw. Who can bear the image of a large truck driving through a defenceless crowd of families? Our default response is to hit back rather than understand. We feel unsafe and it's hard to get perspective.

Living the prayer of Jesus is a relevant today as when it was first said.
