So Meals Plus looks forward to canned and dried goods such as uncooked pasta, rice, cereal. This food helps in feeding around 60 people for breakfast or lunch each day of the week.

Rev Christine has managed to have some great days off and spent time in her garden and catching up with her parents in Goulburn. Thanks to Robyne for stepping up with TOC and for Jan for her continued involvement with TOC while Rev Christine was away.



## **Jeremiah 29:1-7**

1 These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. 2 This was after King Jeconiah, and the queen mother, the court officials, the leaders of Judah and Jerusalem, the artisans, and the smiths had departed from Jerusalem. 3 The letter was sent by the hand of Elasah son of Shaphan and Gemariah son of Hilkiah, whom King Zedekiah of Judah sent to Babylon to King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon. It said: 4 Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: 5 Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. 6 Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. 7 But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for its welfare you will find your welfare. (NRSV Translation)

### **Reflection by Clive Pearson**

What we have here in this reading from the Hebrew Bible is something remarkable. Nebuchadnezzar is the Chaldean king of Babylon. He had waged war on Syria and Judah; in 597 BC he had captured Jerusalem and deposed the king Jehoiakim. Then, 10 years later Jerusalem was destroyed and its most prominent citizens were carried into exile. Jerusalem was desolate. One can imagine the questions which they and those who were left behind in the desolate city and countryside might ask: has God forgotten us? what have we done wrong that God should be so angry with us? Is our God not as strong as their gods? The desolation is spiritual as well as physical and political. One of the nagging questions will be: can God be present with the exiles in another land?

In our age of regular global travel that question of whether God can be present in another land hardly arises. We know that we can go to church in another city in the world. The worship of God does not depend upon our living in one territory. Those exiles do not know that – until this surprising turn of events emerges. They are called to work for the welfare of the city in which they find themselves deported. That call to work for the common good does not come from Nebuchadnezzar. It comes from the “Lord of hosts”. Not only will their God draw near to them in this foreign land: they will also discover that their own wellbeing comes about through working for the good of that city.

This kind of reading is well worth reflecting upon. So many people today have had to flee their lands unwillingly: think of Syria. What Christian scholars on asylum seeking and refugees know is this: faith plays a critical role in helping people move from one place to another and then becoming settled.

## Reflection

These remarkable words from Jeremiah are in the context of the destruction of the homeland and the exile of the people to a foreign land. Here are refugees settling in a new place. The encouragement is to seek the welfare of the city. Actually not encouragement, it is a command. It involves both domestic and civic engagement. Build houses. Raise families. Engage in the economy. Do what you can to make life liveable for all people. This internal and external, domestic and civic engagement in partnership with God is the way to live life to the full. This idea gave rise to our pastoral team slogan for this week: Let us seek the good and wellbeing of everyone in our city so all may thrive. I have met many people whose whole focus was on their family, to the exclusion of all else. I have met others who neglected their families to give all for others, even civic involvement. Much harder and yet much more satisfying is meeting the responsibilities of both domestic and civic, a point that Jeremiah makes.

I had a chat the other night with our Meals Plus Coordinator Paul and Caseworker Phil. They are building on the great work of previous staff in Meals Plus in walking with people on their journey of recovery. Meals Plus has been doing that for over twenty years, and has become well known in the locally and farther afield. Last year someone from Cambridge UK, visited Meals Plus. During Anti-poverty Week, the Uniting Church Synod of NSW.ACT Social Justice Forum will meet at PM, and have a tour and lunch in Meals Plus. Recently a bus load from UnitingCare Australia visited. Paul and Phil were providing support to Coco's the Coptic Orthodox Church who provides a Meals Plus type service to people every Tuesday night in our Macquarie St car park. People can have a meal, obtain clothes, talk to someone, receive some medical assistance and referrals to other services. Coco's have been doing this for 20 years in Parramatta, and about 3 years in our car park. It is a great work that they do, and another typical PM partnership building a community transforming lives.

Paul and Phil have introduced another new partner, Staples, a group who provide fresh food that people with little money can purchase a food hamper for \$20 and get about \$70 worth of food. They set up in the hall during lunch time once a week on a Thursday. It is a great way to assist people without removing their dignity with a hand out. Paul and Phil, with help from Tracey and IT, have set up electronic means to record the data of people coming for breakfast and lunch, which better enables us to analyse the data and make more informed decisions about Meals Plus. There are some more exciting developments about to happen in Meals Plus with some new partnerships that will significantly enhance our work and capability of assisting people who are in poverty. All part of our work of seeking the wellbeing of the city.




