A LIFE OF FAITH & SERVICE

Many in our congregations were saddened to learn of the recent passing of **Gwen Bedford**, wife of the late Rev. Roy Bedford, who served as a Minister of Parramatta Mission between 1979 and 1988. Gwen reached the grand age of 98, having given her life to Christian service in many capacities over multiple decades. She is remembered for her gentle and generous spirit. Our thoughts and prayers are with the Bedford family at this time.

We stopped to remember the events on the Remembrance Day on the 11th. It reminds us all of the great sacrifice given by so many of our ex-servicemen and women- as well as the present service personnel. Please continue to pray for them and their families as we remember and give thanks.

Thursday this week sees John Celebrate his 80th birthday. We are so excited for him and he will head off for a cruise to celebrate. Please wish John well when you see him.

Isaiah 65:17-25

¹⁷ For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. ¹⁸ But be glad and rejoice for ever in what I am creating; or I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight. ¹⁹ I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it, or the cry of distress. ²⁰ No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old person who does not live out a lifetime; for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed. ²¹ They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. ²² They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. ²³ They shall not labour in vain, or bear children for calamity; for they shall be offspring blessed by the Lord - and their descendants as well. ²⁴ Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear. ²⁵ The wolf and the lamb shall feed together, the lion shall eat straw like the ox; but the serpent - its food shall be dust! They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, says the Lord. (NRSV)

Reflections

This Isaiah scripture is from when the Hebrew people returned from a 40 year exile in a foreign land to the devastation of their own. In this desolate place the prophet reminds them that God is not contained in the walls of buildings, nor only for good times. Using the language of poetry and metaphor, the people are encouraged to press forward in hope, in the work of rebuilding their city and lives. God is with them. After calamity, here is a vision of hope and peace in the image of enemies feeding together.

Momentous. That describes the election of Donald Trump. Depending upon your point of view, this is either surprisingly good or shockingly bad. Without doubt a defining moment, perhaps even a world changing event. It is hard to see how this will be good for people such as women, the ill, the poor, people facing homelessness and those living with a mental illness. Prophets will be required to stand up, not with an abrasive or aggressive voice but a considered and engaging voice. Pray for prophets.

Meals Plus has received a makeover under the leadership of Paul with Phil, and our maintenance officer, Mick. Old furniture has been removed, the place repainted, areas opened up, and junk in the hall removed. Thank you for the great effort included early starts and weekends.

This week the WSLARS (the leisure club) team proudly showed me their garden on the balcony of Epworth House. They have an assortment of vegetables growing well. The clients are taking pride in caring for the garden.

The week we welcomed Catlin Scott, our new chaplain at the Children's hospital at Westmead, and member of the pastoral Team. Catlin will also engage with our congregations and staff and residents at Wesley Apartments. Welcome Catlin.

On Wednesday the first Leigh Memorial "Let's Talk about" lectures was held. The gathering heard about dementia. Dementia does not define a person; it is a person living with dementia, who has a story and a history. Alzheimer's is a form of dementia. About 350,000 Australians live with dementia. Only 2% inherit dementia. We are susceptible at any age, but more so as we grow older. Things to keep healthy include: diet, vigorous exercise several times per week that gets blood circulating to the brain, control weight, treat high blood pressure, have nutritional meals, keep social connections including volunteering, learn a new language or musical instrument, and clean teeth with the hand you don't write with. Last Thursday the Meals Plus community gathered in the Court Yard to hold a memorial service for Geraldine Fraser and Kirsten Ford. Both were part of our community and died within 2 days of one another in early October. The Meals Plus community, including reception, was family, and both will be sadly missed.

On Friday, the President of the Assembly of the Uniting Church in Australia. Stuart McMillian visited Meals Plus and recorded his Christmas message. Look out for it on the Assembly web site in mid-December.

This week the group working to call a university chaplain commenced. In church speak this is a Joint Nominating Committee, (JNC). We are seeking a full time university chaplain to be based at both Parramatta and Westmead to engage with the two new WSU campuses, as well as connect with our three congregations, and with a new activated coffee shop in Parramatta, and space at AJ's at Westmead. The role will include exploring new forms of worship in those PM spaces. We hope to have a person commence early in 2017.

Our AGM will be held on Saturday 26 November, 5-8 pm. AGM's have a reputation for being tedious. Not so ours. We include dinner, and the opportunity for people to talk and hear about our work. This year Karen Burns will speak about gambling, and PM programs. We'll gather future issues for our social justice and ethics committee to address. The draft annual review will be released. Dinner is provided. People are invited to bring a desert. A donation for the dinner will be received and go towards our gambling services.

Dear Friends,

Give Hope service and Synod-wide symbolic action

The President of the Uniting Church in Australia, Stuart McMillan, has added his voice to the growing number of advocates calling for a national summit on alternatives to Australia's policies on people seeking asylum.

Our Synod, through the *Give Hope: Uniting for Asylum Seekers* campaign, invites you to support that call by gathering for a special service and engaging in a shared symbolic action.

The summit call is supported by other faith leaders, community groups and more than 2000 academics. With concerns growing from the appalling stories of conditions in detention and our deepening awareness of a world in need, now is the time for a national rethink on better ways of responding to refugees and people seeking asylum.

There will be a special Give Hope service to express our lament at our current treatment of people seeking asylum and our resolve and hope to find a better way. The service will be held at Pitt Street Uniting Church at 3pm on Sunday November 27. Quite fittingly, this Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent, when we reflect on the good news of hope that Jesus brings.

We encourage as many Uniting Church members as can make it, to be part of this gathering. However, we are aware that for a lot of people, especially those outside of Sydney, this will not be possible. But your participation is vital and it can happen through your normal gathering for worship on that day, or as near as possible to that day.

The Give Hope team have provided guidelines (attached) on how congregations and their communities can engage in a simple symbolic action and advocacy and so to take part in the call for a better way. Our hope is that across NSW and the ACT many thousands within Uniting Church congregations and their communities will take this action.

This initiative compliments the call by the Synod and Uniting to designate November 27th Hope Sunday, as a way of highlighting the importance of advocacy and the vocation of the whole church to be bearers of hope.

In its Statement to the Nation in 1977 the newly formed Uniting Church included this declaration:

We pledge ourselves to hope and work for a nation whose goals are not guided by self-interest alone, but by concern for the welfare of all persons everywhere - the family of the One God - the God made known in Jesus of Nazareth, the One who gave His life for others.

In the spirit of that declaration and that example of self-giving, we invite you to join in these events.

The service will express both lament at our nation's treatment of people seeking asylum, and hope that together we can change course and find a better way.

Time: Service at 3pm, followed by afternoon tea

This service will offer:

- a space for lament, prayer and reflection
- a gathering with others struggling with the current situation
- an opportunity to stand together and support the call for a better way

Rev Elenie Poulos, Director of Uniting Justice Australia, will reflect on lament and hope in the context of the situation of refugees and people seeking asylum in Australia. We'll also hear a firsthand account of what it's like to seek asylum and start a new life here.
