Leviticus 19:1-2, 9-18

1 The Lord spoke to Moses, saying: 2 Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them: You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. 9 When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. 10 You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the Lord your God. 11 You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another. 12 And you shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the Lord. 13 You shall not defraud your neighbor; you shall not steal; and you shall not keep for yourself the wages of a laborer until morning. 14 You shall not revile the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind; you shall fear your God: I am the Lord. 15 You shall not render an unjust judgment; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbor. 16 You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not profit by the blood of your neighbour: I am the Lord. 17 You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbor, or you will incur guilt yourself. 18 You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord. (NRSV Translation)

Matthew 5:38-48

38 Jesus said, "You heard it was said, 'An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.' 39 But I say to you do not go against one who is evil. If anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other cheek also; 40 and if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, let them take your coat as well; 41 and if someone forces you to go a mile, go also a second mile. 42 Give to whoever begs of you, and do not turn away anyone who wishes to borrow from you. 43 You heard it said, 'love your neighbour, and hate your enemy.' 44 But I tell you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; because he makes the sun rise on the evil and the good, and rain on just and unjust. 46 For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? 47 And if you greet only your kin what more are you doing than others? Even the Gentiles do the same. 48 Be perfect, therefore, even as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Translation by Keith Hamilton)

Reflections

Pope John XXII in his papal Encycicle *Pacem Terris*:
"nothing is lost by peace; everything may be lost by war."

Excerpts from Barak Obama Cairo Speech, 4 June 2009:

So long as our relationship is defined by our differences, we will empower those who sow hatred rather than peace, those who promote conflict rather than the cooperation that can help all of our people achieve justice and prosperity. . . .

We have the power to make the world we seek, but only if we have the courage to make a new beginning, keeping in mind what has been written. The Holy Koran tells us: "O mankind! We have created you male and a female; and we have made you into nations and tribes so that you may know one another." The Talmud tells us: "The whole of the Torah is for the purpose of promoting peace." The Holy Bible tells us: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God."

The people of the world can live together in peace. We know that is God's vision. Now that must be our work here on Earth.

Martin Luther King said, "We must not seek to defeat or humiliate the enemy but to win their friendship and understanding."

Excerpts from JFK American University Speech, June 10, 1963

What kind of peace do I mean? What kind of peace do we seek? Not a Pax Americana enforced on the world by American weapons of war. Not the peace of the grave or the security of the slave. I am talking about genuine peace, the kind of peace that makes life on earth worth living, the kind that enables men and women and nations to grow and to hope and to build a better life for their children--not merely peace for Americans but peace for all men and women--not merely peace in our time but peace for all time.

All this is not unrelated to world peace. "When a man's ways please the Lord," the Scriptures tell us, "He maketh even his enemies to be at peace with him." And is not peace, in the last analysis, basically a matter of human rights--the right to live out our lives without fear of devastation--the right to breathe air as nature provided it--the right of future generations to a healthy existence?

Ghandi said "An eye for an eye only makes the whole world blind."

Mother Teresa said,

"let us always meet each other with a smile, for the smile is the beginning of love."

And,

"I have found the paradox, that if you love until it hurts, there can be no more hurt, only more love."
