Reflections

Kent Crawford and Lyle Steffensen married on Holy Saturday. The photo is of them eating their wedding cake. Holy Saturday is between Good Friday and Easter Day. The significance for Christians is it is the day when Jesus is dead in the tomb. Lyle and Kent chose the day because each has experienced sadness and trauma in the end of a first marriage, and wanted to mark the in-between the 'death' of the old, and the 'birth' of the new. Easter is a reminder for all of us that in life in so many different ways each one of us will experience brokenness and sorrow whether at the death of a loved one, or the end of friendship or romance, the shattering of a dream, the end of a job or career path, and for a time there is grief and it might even seem like being dead in a tomb, before there is a resurrection to new life. It is the Easter promise. The resurrection is always to something new that will be different to the past.



It was our delight to host a visit by the Governor of NSW, His Excellency General The Honourable David Hurley, and Mrs Hurley on Thursday of last week.

The visit included serving lunch and having lunch in Meals Plus, conversations with clients, then a visit to WSLARS to meet some of the members. We presented the Governor with a print of our Hope painting from Meals Plus.




Some of us were treated to the delight of hearing Mrs Hurley sing a hymn from the choir conductors stand high in the Leigh Memorial Church.
