





Matthew 28:16-20

Reflections

Christians celebrate this Sunday as Trinity Sunday. Trinity is the doctrine that God is three and one; Creator, Son, Spirit; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. But words will always fail us to speak of the mystery of God. Our best human efforts can never adequately speak of the God who is beyond us yet beside us, around us and even in us, drawing, guiding, counselling, and judging and gracing. So the words we use need to be carefully selected to allow that no words can adequately describe or speak of God who created all things, yet came among us in Jesus, and continues to encounter the world today through Spirit. The point of the doctrine is not so much intellectual understanding but to assist people worship the mystery of God who created all, yet can give guidance to assist in living our life.



I just spent two days with this wonderful group of PM people undertaking the Mental Health First Aid Training.

The facilitators were Sonia Norton and Ryan Casey, who led the course very well, engaged all the participants and were knowledgeable of the subject. I would recommend all staff and all congregants and all volunteers of PM undertake this training. Indeed, I agree with Ryan and Sonia who opined that it would be good for everyone in Australia to do the training and become an accredited Mental Health First Aider. It would make a tremendous difference to raising the issue of mental health, particularly given that about 1 in 5 Australians will experience a mental illness in the course of their life, every day 28 Australians attempt suicide and every day 12 Australians complete suicide – higher than the road toll.

The World Health Organisation defined mental health as:

. . . a state of well-being in which the individual realises his or her own abilities, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to his or her community.

The Mental Health First Aid Manual defines a mental disorder or mental illness as:

An illness that affects a person's thinking, emotional state and behaviour, and disrupts the person's ability to work or carry out other daily activities and engage in satisfying personal relationships.

ALGEE is a Mental Health First Aid Action Plan. ALGEE stands for:

Approach the person, assess and assist with any crisis
Listen and communicate non-judgementally
Give support and information
Encourage the person to get appropriate professional help
Encourage other supports

It complements doing the First Aid Course, which I also think everyone should complete.

These are practical tools that can assist us fulfil the commandment of Jesus to “love you neighbour as you love yourself.”

inSpiring the Common Good

Through the life and witness of its congregations, through its delivery of social services, Parramatta Mission is seeking to redevelop its site and be a source of inspiration in the life of Sydney's 'central city'. It is seeking to align its life with 5 theological principles.

Leigh Memorial Church seeks to be:

5) A place which is open to God's future¹

- which lies beyond our here and now;^{2 3}
- which is open to being led by the Spirit in ways which are faithful to the
- Christ through whom, in whom, and for whom all things were made;⁴
- and which looks forward to the fulfilment of the kingdom of God and the reconciliation of all things.^{5 6}

Prayer: You have set us within this moment of time, God of all time: you have set us within this place, God whose Spirit blows where it wills. We seek to follow the way of Jesus Christ who draws near each and every time, each and every place. We give you thanks of the heritage in which we stand. Help us to become a 'living tradition' and make room for the Christ who lies ahead of us. Ay we be willing to take up our cross and be a pilgrim people, on the way to a promised end.

¹ There are two words used in Greek to denote time. The first is *chronos* which is calendar time, linear time, past, present and future time. The second is *Kairos* which is 'the right time', an appointed time. In terms of strategic plans and its internal life the church often functions in terms of *chronos* time; Jesus, however, asks us to discern the signs of the times, *Kairos* time, the right time for when the kingdom of God is breaking into our everyday world, while, at the same *chronos* moment, transcending our concern for diaries and dates (Luke 12:54-56).

² The Christian faith looks back in time to the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Christ; the call to follow is an ongoing call made in the present; the life of faith is also established in the hope of Christ's return. It looks towards the future. It should never allow itself to become settled in the present. The doctrine of Christ's 'ascension' (Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:6-11) 'liberates' Jesus from first century Palestine to become available to all in and through the Spirit.

³ According to Paragraph 18 of the Basis of Union:

"The Uniting Church affirms that it belongs to the people of God on the way to the promised end. The Uniting Church prays that, through the gift of the Spirit, God will constantly correct that which is erroneous in its life, will bring it into deeper unity with other Churches, and will use its worship, witness and service to God's eternal glory through Jesus Christ the Lord."

⁴ So often our journeys of faith become accounts of "me (and people like me) and Jesus". The scope of Christian believing is much greater than this. Its cosmic scope is best captured in Colossians 1:15-23.

⁵ According to Paragraph 3 of the Basis of Union:

"The Church as the fellowship of the Holy Spirit confesses Jesus as Lord over its own life; it also confesses that Jesus is Head over all things, the beginning of a new creation, of a new humanity. God in Christ has given to all people in the Church the Holy Spirit as a pledge and foretaste of that coming reconciliation and renewal which is the end in view for the whole creation. The Church's call is to serve that end: to be a fellowship of reconciliation, a body within which the diverse gifts of its members are used for the building up of the whole, an instrument through which Christ may work and bear witness to himself. The Church lives between the time of Christ's death and resurrection and the final consummation of all things which Christ will bring; the Church is a pilgrim people, always on the way towards a promised goal; here the Church does not have a continuing city but seeks one to come. On the way Christ feeds the Church with Word and Sacraments, and it has the gift of the Spirit in order that it may not lose the way."

⁶ The Christian faith looks to an 'end time' – the eschaton (from the Greek for "last things"). On occasions hints or intimations of that end time break into our here and now. Project inSpire seeks to serve the kingdom of God; it looks towards that 'end time' – 'a new city, a new heaven' – but does so in the present moment.

⁷The word 'tradition' comes from a Latin verb, *tradere* which means 'to hand over'. And, so tradition has to do what was handed on to us and what will be handed on by us to those who come after us.
