## ARCHAEOLOGICAL DIGGING - REAR OF LEIGH MEMORIAL

For some time now, teams of archaeologists have been digging in the sites to the side and rear of Leigh Memorial ahead of the commencement of building work for the new Parramatta Square.

Last Friday afternoon, Ian, Liz, Neil, Darlene & Callum met with Wendy, one of the Archaeologists, to take a special tour of the dig just to the rear of the church. In the photos below, you can see the drain (bottom left, originally built by convicts) which traverses the land to the rear and goes under the Fellowship Hall, plus Wendy (bottom, right) standing on the site of a Plaster Factory and Animal Pound which once also existed to the rear of us. The sites of some original fence posts have been noted on the block, as have traces of plaster left over from the work of the factory.

The view towards the Town Hall (top right) also shows the foundations of Leigh Memorial's Wesley Hall and Ferguson Wing (built 1954) and the view (top left) of the Archaeologists with their digging equipment - excavating areas of the old drain to look for further evidence of convict construction and the early topography of what was a very 'soggy' zone. The experience of visiting the site and/or liaising with archaeological teams has provided important heritage insight/data for us - and in turn, provided useful, local anecdotal information for their investigations - the PM Heritage Committee.

# 'THE SULTAN & THE SAINT'

'**The Sultan & the Saint**' is the story of two men of faith, one a traveling Christian preacher, the other the ruler of a Muslim Empire, who bucked a century of war, distrust, and propaganda in a search for common ground.

It is the story of **Francis of Assisi** and the **Sultan of Egypt**, and their meeting on a bloody battlefield during the period of Christian- Muslim conflict known as the 'Crusades'. One of the film's stars is Oscar-winner, Jeremy Irons.

# Sydney Alliance Housing Assembly

Hi, Uniting friends,

The Social Justice Forum has been active over the past two years with the Sydney Alliance (in which the Uniting Church and Uniting are partners) to improve rental affordability across Greater Sydney

**Specifically, we're advocating for the NSW Government to set clear targets** for Inclusionary Zoning (IZ) – to set aside (at point of rezoning) a percentage of units in new developments to be available at lower-income-affordable rents. Our targets are at least 15% of units in developments on private land, and 30% on government-owned land.

Wed July 12: Affordable Housing Assembly with NSW Minister Anthony Roberts Following our intensive campaign with our Sydney Alliance partners over the past two years, the NSW Opposition has pledged its support for (very close to) our IZ targets. Our Eastwood Assembly on May 4 with Minister Roberts was a great success, but we now need even bigger attendance at this July 12 event to get the government over the line on helping lower-income renters. **So far they've done nothing significant for this group - we're very hopeful that just a little extra push will shift them to a more favourable position.** We need to pack the hall! Mr Roberts will be **there again, and representatives of the government's Greater Sydney Commission.** Catholic Archbishop Fisher will be there, along with our own Moderator, Peter Worland and others from Uniting, and people from our congregations all around Sydney.

Dear Mr Hamilton,

I would like to update you on changes happening on Darcy Street as part of the \$2 billion Parramatta Square urban renewal project.

Developer Walker Corporation will install new hoarding in the coming week that will allow Darcy Street to remain open to pedestrians during the early phases of excavation and construction.

Pedestrian access will be through an enclosed walkway to protect the public during excavation and construction. This enclosed walkway means access from Parramatta train station to Darcy Street will be retained.

It would be greatly appreciated if you could pass on this information to members of the Parramatta Mission and Leigh Memorial Church community so they are informed of these changes.

It's important to note that the route around the Parramatta CBD will not change although it will look slightly different and people will notice more work happening on the site as Walker Corporation progresses with excavation work.

The enclosed walkway will be well-lit, and a security patrol will also monitor the area between 6.30pm and 6.30am.

It is envisaged Darcy Street will need to close to pedestrians in future to allow for the completion of Parramatta Square. City of Parramatta Council will keep the community updated on further changes as the program of works and timing is confirmed.

# What is the Gospel?

What is the Gospel? It's seemingly such a simple question. It feels so familiar. You would expect that we should be able to answer it off the top of our heads. And yet that's not what happened at a conference I attended recently. We had come together for the sake of 'what was called Gospel Yarning'. We came from many different cultures. We were a people immersed within the life of the church. And we talked a lot about a variety of things.

There were those who spoke of love, hope, peace and justice. There were others who talked about good news – which is what the old English word gospel means. We use it to translate the Greek word found in the New Testament: *'euaggelion'* from which we get evangelism. There was a lot of talk about the church and maybe the gap that can arise between what we wish the church was like and what it is really like. There were others who reflected on how we engage with people of other faiths or demonstrate a concern for refugees or show hospitality to newcomers or those on the margins. One woman spoke about how walking alongside Aboriginal people was for her 'the gospel'. And then there were those who picked up on the theme to be found in Paul's epistle to Galatians and which refers 'to 'the gospel of creation' – and hence their passion was for the care of creation in a time of climate change.

In the midst of all this yarning there was a recurring question: what is the gospel? It felt like at times we were on the edges of what has once been taken for granted. I had been given the task of being a theological reflector for the conference – and I couldn't help but notice a couple of things.

The first thing I observed was a series of absences or omissions. I was troubled by the failure to speak of joy. It's a word I seldom here used in services of worship – and, when we seek to talk about our life together, it often seems to be overlooked. The fact of the matter is that joy is the second most commonly used disposition or 'fruit' of the Spirit mentioned in the epistles: it is second only to love. If we were seeking to speak about the gospel – or good news – where was the joy?

The second thing I noticed was a result of where I had been the previous weekend. I am on the advisory board of the Affinity Intercultural Society. That is Muslim body which is committed to interfaith relations and seeking the well-being of Australian society. The days just prior to the conference I had spent in Melbourne as a guest of Affinity and had attended an international festival of music and cultures. Those values to do with love, faith, peace and hope were the same ones being used by our Muslim hosts. They were values upon which we could agree but that did not necessarily mean that they constituted 'the gospel'. They described our common humanity and represented – in our case – a desire to live the Christian life.



There seemed to be something missing in this conference to do with Gospel yarning. I found myself noting that talk about Jesus was inclined to focus upon his life, ministry and teaching – and maybe healing. We might say it fastened upon his humanity. And all of that is good. That needs to happen. For too long in the past it seemed we sang hymns which overlooked what Jesus did during his life on earth. The funny thing that sometimes was happening now was that our discussions on peace, hope, justice, love, engaging with other faiths and social justice in general was being detached from any talk about who Christ is for us – for you and for me.

It also struck me that perhaps, we had lost some confidence about what the apostle Paul calls the 'word of the cross'. What Paul is referring to here is the resurrection and ascension of Christ as well as the crucifixion of Jesus of Nazareth. And for Paul the word of the cross – and what it signifies – is the gospel. Of course Paul recognized that this word of the cross was a folly and a stumbling block to most people in his own day. It was just plain odd. The writer of Luke's gospel believed the resurrection initially seemed like an 'idle tale'. And yet it was this 'story', this 'news' that inspired and transformed a fearful, apprehensive huddle of disciples into a church which was joyful (even when it was suffering for Christ's sake) and which offered a clarity of moral and spiritual vision.

What then is the gospel? Why was this conference about Gospel yarning frequently asking this question even while its participants were engaged with many good deeds in their everyday, ordinary living?

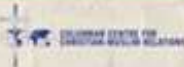

It is with sadness that I inform you of the passing of Darug Elder Uncle Greg Smith, whose Darug connection was from Yarramundi and his daughter Maria Locke. Uncle Greg was also connected to Bennelong.

Uncle Greg was an unforgettable character and everyone who witnessed his Welcome to Country messages at Council and community events or his slam poetry renditions will remember him fondly and well.

In the last year Uncle Greg suffered from a debilitating disease which exacerbated his other ailments including limited eye sight. Through all of this he remained vital and active and continued to attend numerous events and offer a welcome to country and perform ceremony whenever he could.

Always with a smile and passion Uncle Greg advocated for Darug peoples including almost 2 years with Council's Darug Reference Panel, as a frequent observer at our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Advisory Committee and participating in many community consultations including the Culture and Our City: Curated Conversations evening. His image and words are also beautifully captured in the City of Parramatta's Draft Cultural Plan.

Uncle Greg was due to participate at our RAP launch on Friday and to give the Welcome to Country at Burrarmatta NAIDOC. He will be remembered at these 2 events and into the future.

I will pass on any details that become available for those who wish to attend Uncle Greg's funeral, or pass on their respects to his family.
