



'**The Sultan & the Saint**' is the story of two men of faith, one a traveling Christian preacher, the other the ruler of a Muslim Empire, who bucked a century of war, distrust, and propaganda in a search for common ground.

It is the story of **Francis of Assisi** and the **Sultan of Egypt**, and their meeting on a bloody battlefield during the period of Christian- Muslim conflict known as the 'Crusades'. One of the film's stars is Oscar-winner, Jeremy Irons.

The screening is being co-hosted by Affinity Intercultural Foundation, plus the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay, the Columban Centre for Christian-Muslim Relations, the Diocese of Parramatta, the Franciscan Provincial Office Australia, Islamic Sciences and Research Academy(ISRA), the Uniting Church in Australia, and Western Sydney University. MC for the film's Australian premiere in Parramatta is Journalist, Hugh Riminton.

What is the Gospel? 2

We live in a media saturated world. It is everywhere: on screens, on ear plugs, on paper. We live in a world where news has become 24/7. For some events we can have a ‘rolling news cycle’ and the standard production of television news can often be interrupted with a reporter on the spot, signalling to us “breaking news”. We might even say that there is a “news industry” and sometimes the media who hand on to the news to us are deemed to be “celebrities” (if they are ‘front’ man or woman).

We live in a time when the news is often contested. Over the course of the last several months we have seen the invention of such terms as “fake news” and “alternative facts”. We know that media outlets are inclined to carry a particular perspective on a matter under discussion. If you read *The Daily Telegraph* or *The Australian*, and the person sitting next to you prefers the *Sydney Morning Herald*, then our “take” on what is happening in politics or sensitive cultural issues is liable to be marked by that interpretation of the “news”.

And, of course, so often the “news” that is beamed into our homes – or through our ever increasing range of receptive devices – is nearly always some form of bad news. There is the regular coverage of police incidents, war, the plight of refugees, and politicians falling out with one another. Our “news” is framed: it is organized in a certain way. Jolyon Mitchell was previously a BBC World journalist but is now a theological professor in Edinburgh. He has paid very careful attention to the way in which the media “frames” the violence of natural disasters as well as military and political conflict. Scott Bader Saye is another theologian interested in the media – but this time from the perspective of living in the United States. What he wishes to convey is his feeling that the news industry / the media often seeks to play upon our fears and anxiety.

We may note that there is, now and then, on the news a good news story. That story that can be a heart-warming account; it is all the more heart-warming because it can stand out over and against the wall-to-wall coverage of problems and disputes. Sometimes, of course, the media doesn’t want to convey examples of such good news. The default position can be one that favours sensational news. That is what happened during the uneasy tension following the Cronulla riots of 2005. The church hall in Auburn was next door to a Muslim school. The church hall was burnt down and the media jumped to conclusions. They were looking for a “good story” – which, for them and the production team that frames the news, would have been another example of bad blood between ‘those of Middle Eastern appearance’ and others.

The only trouble with this story is that when they arrived on the scene, the leader of the Uniting Church and the local Muslim leader were walking down the street arm in arm and the Muslims allowed the church to meet in their hall while repairs were being made. None of that featured on the nightly news.

This business of the news is important for Christians. It is important for us personally and also for the sake of our life together. We cannot help being concerned with the news because the call to follow Christ is to participate in the gospel – and that word ‘gospel’ means “good news”. For some that good news might mean seeking to live life in all its fullness; for others it might mean a quiet acknowledgement of the gift of life, despite many setbacks and failing health.

This year the question of what is good news is posed with a fresh urgency in two ways. The first is a matter of numbers – in other words, statistics and the census. It seems as if the percentage of folk who call themselves Christian in this country is in decline. That hardly seems to be good news. It may make us feel like we have failed in some way to live out the gospel. Or, it might be a spur for us to clarify for ourselves and for our life together what we think the gospel is and how we might sow seeds, be like yeast, be a light to the city.

The second reason has to do with the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther nailing his 95 Theses to a church door (so it is said) and set in motion the Reformation. That is the events that leads to the division between Protestant and Catholic. All of the churches which came into the Uniting Church look back to Luther. He struggled with what was the good news. He tried to make himself a spiritually better person – but failed; he tried to do the things which might make him a more moral person and thus acceptable to God – but he failed. He tried to justify himself in all sorts of way – but he failed, as indeed, he would argue, we all do. Luther came to the conclusion that it was God who justifies us: that somehow through the example, the death and the resurrection of Christ God is reconciled to us.

That news is also framed in a particular way. It depends upon this narrative line or plot. It involves language that is increasingly not commonly used in society at large – at least in a religious sense. The tell tale words are words like forgiveness, sin and grace. It is almost as if this kind of good news has its own language – and, for the sake of the gospel, we are encouraged to use it and live it out.
