Matthew 18:21-35

21 Then Peter came to Jesus and said, "Lord, how often shall a member of the church sin against me, and I forgive him or her? As many as seven times?" 22 Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times but seventy times seven. 23 The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. 24 And when he began the reckoning, one was brought to him who owed equal to 20 years wages; 25 and as he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, and his wife, and his children, and all that he had, and the payment to be made. 26 So the servant fell down on his knees and implored him saying, 'Be patient with me, and I will repay you everything'. 27 Filled with tenderness, the master of the servant released him, and forgave the loan. 28 But going out that servant found one of his fellow servants who owed him a day's wages; and seizing him by the throat so that he nearly choked him, said, 'Repay what you owe.' 29 So his fellow servant fell down on his knees and pleaded to him saying, 'Be patient with me and I will repay you.' 30 He refused; but he went and threw him into prison until he would repay what was owed. 31 When his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went to their master and explained everything. 32 Then his master called him forward and said to him, 'You evil servant! I forgave all your debt, because you requested me. 33 Shouldn't you also have had mercy on your fellow servant, even as I had mercy on you?' 34 And being angry, his master delivered him to the torturers until he should repay everything owing him. 35 So also your heavenly Father will do to you if you do not each forgive your brother or sister from your heart."
