COMMUNITY LIVING SUPPORTS Central Coast



What is Community Living Supports (CLS)?

CLS is designed to provide recovery orientated support to people who have a diagnosis of severe mental illness or mental health disorder resulting in significant functional impairment.

CLS is a free and voluntary service providing non-clinical support.



CLS is delivered in partnership with:

NSW Ministry of Health
Family and Community Services (FACS)

Corrective Services NSW



What supports are provided?

CLS can assist with (but not limited to):

- Building a support network
- Learning self-care skills and strategies
- Support with daily living skills
- Medication monitoring
- Hospital to home transitions
- Correctional facility to home transitions
- Support with accessing NDIS
- Focusing on independence, self-capacity building, creating/strengthening support networks, community inclusion/participation, education and vocational participation

Priority referrals

People referred to CLS are assessed according to relative need and when all other factors are equal, priority will be given to those who:

- Are in hospital due to their high support needs
- Are in a social housing tenancy that is at risk due to antisocial behaviour related to severe mental illness
- Are serving a community detention order

Eligibility Criteria

To participate in CLS, people must meet the following general eligibility criteria:

- Age 16 years or over
- Are diagnosed with a severe mental illness
- Experience disability primarily stemming from a mental health diagnosis which impacts on their day to day functioning including issues around maintaining their accommodation
- Have genuinely consented to participate in the program
- Are willing to engage with non-clinical support services and have the ability to live in the community
- Live within the geographical region of Central Coast NSW

People who are currently supported through a nursing home or aged care facility or their primary functional disability is attributed to non-mental health cause i.e. acquired brain injury, developmental disability, are not eligible for CLS.
