Homelessness Week is an annual week coordinated by Homelessness Australia to raise awareness of people experiencing homelessness, the issues they face and the action needed to achieve enduring solutions. Homelessness Week came about from various churches and missions running winter vigils to remember people who had died on the streets. These vigils were normally held in August as it is the coldest time of the year and when most people were likely to be overcome by the elements.

Homelessness Week activities in Parramatta bring together a number of church, welfare, government, motorcycle and other community groups who organise events that encourage a positive appreciation of the issues and needs of those who are homeless in the Parramatta Region.

Reflections

Many churches across the world follow a set schedule of Bible Readings in a three year cycle, and also follow a schedule of church celebrations. This Sunday, the Sunday after Pentecost, is usually celebrated as Trinity Sunday. Trinity Sunday gives attention to the Christian affirmation that God is creator, redeemer, and living giving Spirit, or as it is traditionally expressed, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is not three Gods but one God in three persons. Then it gets complex. Every way of considering God as Trinity is inadequate, because we are trying to use human ideas and language to speak about God is both with us and beyond us, who created the world, yet was born as Jesus who lived and was put to death, yet who was raised from the dead and ascended to be with God the Father, and who then sent the Holy Spirit to gather, guide, encourage and invigorate people in God.

These discussions about the mystery of God as Trinity have been with us since the time of Jesus, and certainly since the time of the Nicene Creed, which has sought to express this faith since the fourth century. I find it useful to include the Nicene Creed in my daily prayers.

The Nicene Creed - English Language Liturgical Commission translation

We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, light from light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary
and became truly human.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father [and the Son],
who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.


