The feature of our heritage acknowledgements in 2019 is the **40th anniversary of 175/Wesley Lodge Motel and Christian Centre (inc. 'Upper Room'), Westmead** (opened 10 June 1979). The commencement of Parramatta Mission's Motel at Westmead was part of a visionary plan by Dr. Gloster Udy (1918-2003) and an enthusiastic cohort of Mission members & supporters at Parramatta and Westmead who sought to provide a site offering accommodation, refreshments, prayer and comfort close to the Westmead medical precinct. 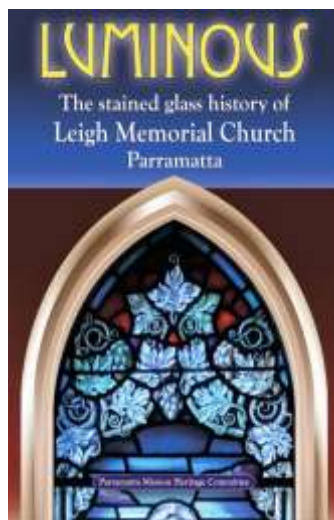
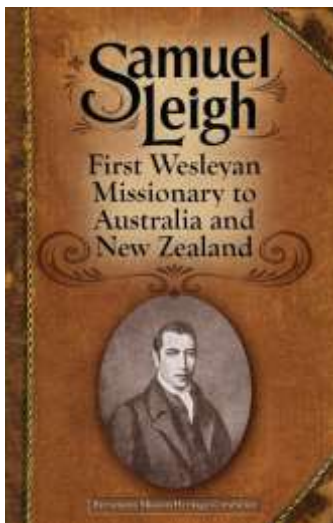

Hi everyone,

Another good news story, today I would like to acknowledge the amazing efforts of Lifeline Western Sydney team, what an awesome service.

Across the month of May, Lifeline Western Sydney reached a grand total of **624** logged in hours and answered a total on **1380** calls from people in need

82% of those calls were from people in crisis
83% of those calls involved a discussion on suicide

In order to do this, we provided an average of **156 shifts** during the month.

Imagine how many lives we potentially saved, How many people we averted suicide for and how much positive change we have made.

1380 calls per month means we could help over 16,000 people each year.

Well done Lifeline Western Sydney what an amazing achievement, keep up the great work!!!

Foster your faith this week

2Kgs 5:1-14 Ps 30

Gal 6:(1-6), 7-16 Lk 10:1-11, 16-20

Galatians 5:1, 13-25

1 For freedom, Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not be entangled with a yoke of slavery. 13 For you were called to freedom, sisters and brothers; only do not use freedom for the advantage of the flesh, but through love be servants of one another. 14 For the whole law has been fulfilled in one word, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." 15 But if you bite and devour one another, watch you are not destroyed by one another. 16 I mean this, walk by the Spirit and there is no likely hood you will desire the flesh. 17 For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the Spirit is against the flesh; for these oppose each other, in order that you not do what you wish. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. 19 Now the works of the flesh are manifest: fornication, impurity, indecency, 20 idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, divisions, factions, 21 envy, drunkenness, orgies, and like things to these; which I warn you as I warned you previously, that those who practice such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God. 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law. 24 And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. (Translation by Keith Hamilton)

Reflection

Paul writes to the church in Galatia expressing his concern that they are about to lose their freedom in Christ by choosing to be bound to legalism. He makes it clear that the church in Galatia has not only been released from something, it is freedom for something, namely for a relationship with the God who loves all and with all that God loves.

Giving people the commandment to love, telling people that they must love others does not help unless their "default setting" has been altered. People will become loving towards others as their lives reflect more the goodness of God. That means dealing with the hurts and false hopes from the past, in order to receiving healing and release.

Hugh McKay suggested that people have become disconnected from people, and this disconnection leads to a fragmentation. People are unlikely to develop sensitivity towards others unless we regard them as members of our community. Hurtful acts are usually perpetrated against people whom we do not value. Hugh MacKay wrote "Freedom to choose is no freedom at all unless it is accompanied by the confidence of knowing we have made the *right* choice."

A certain footballer has miss-quoted a scripture that has some resonance to a few verses in the scripture herein. The miss-quote from the Bible then has been used to exclude. The exclusive language has breached employment contract law that in the footballer's case, included social media. The hypocrisy of the debate that follows is the suggestion that it is a matter of free speech, yet the groups who have grabbed the microphone proclaiming free speech are the very same groups who insist on selective employment practices about gender, sexuality, race and religious beliefs in their schools and organisations. A second hypocrisy is that a multimillionaire, with multiple million-dollar assets has raised millions of dollars to run a court case he is initiating and is supported by people who want religious freedom but whose practise are religious restrictions to a certain religion. The people who are supporting the funding are noteworthily absent from funding the 60% of prison inmates who are illiterate, the schools where teachers fund activates out of their own pockets, people facing homelessness, women and children escaping domestic violence with nowhere to go but sleep in cars, or under bridges or prostitute themselves for accommodation, and the list goes on. Two million dollars could make a tremendous difference to the lives of people who live on the edge every day. Just \$200,000 would make a tremendous difference through Meals Plus.

Meanwhile, I'm informed that 12 people in our Meals Plus community have died an early death this year. One, David, this week, was 57, and had been part of our community for more than 10 years. A highly intelligent man with a Master's degree in English Literature from Sydney University, yet tormented by experiences of the past. It is less than a month since PM assisted with some clothes and a member of staff accompanied David to the Iftar dinner, where he engaged in theological and philosophical discussion with scholars. I shall miss our daily chat. Rest in Peace David.

The building is called Bethel, after the name of the government officer in charge of the female factory. Jews and Christians would be familiar with the name of Bethel as the name of a sacred place; this place was a house of horror, where all sorts of atrocities occurred, some included in the recent royal commission for institutional responses to child sexual assault.





Former Parra Girl, Bonny Djuric OAM, artist, and instrumental in the preservation and heritage listing of the Parramatta Female factory. (And a member of my family).



This quilt that Bonny made honours the orphans who are buried at the site. The red crosses represent girls, the blue, boys, and the grey in the middle children whose gender as well as name is unknown.



These scratches on the walls are from girls who were locked in solitary confinement.

The call to love our neighbour is a relevant today as always.
