¹ Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock!

You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth

² before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh.

Stir up your might, and come to save us!

³ Restore us, O God;

let your face shine, that we may be saved.

⁴ O Lord God of hosts,

how long will you be angry with your people's prayers?

Reflections

The bible contains many different genres of literature. Psalm 80 is a lament. Laments are an open and transparent cry to God about the grief of an issue or issues. They often express raw emotion. This lament has probably been edited at a later date, mixing concerns about the destruction of Samaria, the northern Kingdom of Israel, and picking up later images and concerns about Jerusalem. God is addressed in several ways (vv. 1, 4, 7, 14), there is lament itself (vv. 4b-6, 12-13, 16), petition (vv. 1-2, 14-15-17) and the vow of praise (v. 18). The refrain in vv. 3, 7, and 19 reiterates the petition for deliverance throughout the psalm. Laments are an expression of faith in God, even while having harsh words or questions of God. This one finishes with a petition to be restored to God.

The engagement day included a visit to Lifeline Western Sydney:
Did you know this about Lifeline Western Sydney?

- Last year LLWS answered 11,135 calls from people in need. That is an average of 928 calls each month.
- Total logged in hours: 4740 hours
- Average of 100 volunteers
- So far in 2019 there has been two classes to train up new volunteers, February and June.
- Each class requires classroom lectures usually of a Tuesday night in the Lifeline Training Room in the Fellowship Centre in Parramatta, followed by time on the phones.
- The June class are now in the phone room preparing to take calls.
- Each telephone volunteer is required to give 92 hours voluntary telephone counselling over 12 months, each year to maintain accreditation.
- We answer calls for reasons including:
 - ◆ Suicidal thoughts
 - ◆ Relational difficulties
 - ◆ Mental illness
 - ◆ Domestic violence
 - ◆ Addictive behaviour
 - ◆ Social isolation
 - ◆ Disabilities
- 80% of calls by LLWS specifically addressed suicide.
Lifeline Australia is launching a new CARE model of training in 2020. The LLWS Out of the Shadows Walk is planned for 10 September. It will commence at 5 am at 153 George St, Parramatta, and proceed along the riverbank towards Lennox Bridge. It will be followed by breakfast at 153 George St, Parramatta. Other Lifeline centres will also be conducting Out of the Shadows Walks.
- A comment from a care seeker of LLWS:
I clearly remember feeling that my life had purpose and there was a reason to stay alive after calling lifeline. I was so sick of the routines in the mental health system. But, Lifeline is so accessible, unintimidating and immediate. They listen and care without judgement.
