THE CORE QUESTION: HOW CAN WE BE THE CHURCH OF JESUS IN A SECULAR WORLD?

Our answers to this core question in the recent past have simply not worked. We are not confident. Gospel Yarning will help the church to speak to the wider world and not diminish with age.

If we re-connect to the core purpose of the church, Jesus and his Kingdom, we will gain direction, grow stronger, and find our distinctive voice. What will we say when society forms its impression of the church and Christians from the images and comments in the media? What is the Gospel that we can speak as the good news? We must admit that our credibility is low. Our bad deeds have brought us shame and our many good deeds are not well connected with our good news. How can we find our voice to say, with integrity and respect, so why do we do so much for the common good – what is it about this love of God in Christ?

Our secular society with its economic rationalism has turned each person and each place into resources for profit. It is wounding our young people, crushing local cultures and trashing the planet. Where is the voice of the church? What is our Gospel?

Jeremiah 29:1-7

1 These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. 2 This was after King Jeconiah, and the queen mother, the court officials, the leaders of Judah and Jerusalem, the artisans, and the smiths had departed from Jerusalem. 3 The letter was sent by the hand of Elasah son of Shaphan and Gemariah son of Hilkiah, whom King Zedekiah of Judah sent to Babylon to King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon. It said: 4 Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: 5 Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. 6 Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. 7 But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.
(NRSV)

These remarkable words from Jeremiah are in the context of the destruction of the homeland and the exile of the people to a foreign land. The direction is to seek the welfare of the city. It involves both domestic and civic engagement. Build houses. Raise families. Engage in the economy. Live a life to the full. Do what you can to make life liveable for all people. This internal and external, domestic and civic engagement in partnership with God is the way to live life to the full.

When people are feeling under threat, for whatever reason, the temptation is to pull back. Most people do. It seems like the wise and safe thing to do. But not the people of faith. People of faith know that retreating into a ghetto is not the wise or safe thing to do. The people of faith know that God is in all places. The Psalmist said even the darkness is as light for God is in all places, to the farthest extremes of the east and west, north and south, highest and lowest places, and beyond. There is nowhere where God is not! So the church is in the world, although not off the world. The church must not try to escape from the world.

Jurgen Moltmann wrote, "Every crisis means finding new bearings. The fundamental questions have to be answered afresh: Where do you come from? Where are you going? Who are you?" Davis McCaughey answered these questions in his sermon at the inauguration of the Uniting Church in 1977. "Where do you come from? From the hand of the living God who engaged people in a new way through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and the outpouring of his Spirit. Where are you going? To make disciples of all nations to fulfil the commission with which we have been charged. Who are you? A people with whom that same Christ has promised that he will be present, to the close of the ages." McCaughey answers with a message of resurrection hope, themes expressed in the Basis of Union. The Basis (Para 1) "The Church of God is committed to serve the world for which Christ died, and that it awaits with hope the day of the Lord Jesus Christ on which it will be clear that the kingdom of this world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of the Christ, who shall reign for ever and ever."

The text from Jeremiah explicitly speaks to people in the city, but by inference, it speaks no less so to people in regional and rural areas, seek the welfare of all in the place where you are. A hymn that is a favourite of many church folk is: Guide me O though great redeemer, pilgrim through this barren land. It has a great singable tune. It is a hymn inspired by the people of faith in Hebrew times (2,500 years ago) who having escaped from captivity, spent 40 years in the wilderness. But, for the first peoples of Australia, this was never a barren land, if you knew where to look, and what to look for. Likewise, the message of Jesus is that God is as much in rural places, where he spent most of his ministry, as elsewhere. It is the kind of thinking that inspired our vision: A community transforming lives. Parramatta Mission is located in the centre of the city, and also located in metropolitan and regional areas, and rural places. God is present in all such places. Wherever we are, we seek the welfare of the people.

Preparing for An Advent Study


