

HERITAGE SUNDAY 2020 @ PARRAMATTA MISSION



Sunday 21 June is 'Heritage Sunday' at Parramatta Mission – an important part of the annual celebration of our mutual history, commencing with the ministry of Rev. Samuel Leigh in 1815 and extending for over 200 years of 'worship, witness and service' at Parramatta and Westmead. Our 2020 acknowledgements include the 43rd anniversary of the UCA (1977), the 10th anniversary of Wesley Apartments (2010), the 40th anniversary of Koombartoo (1980), the 135th anniversary of Leigh Memorial Church (1885) and the 200th anniversary of the birth of Parramatta-born evangelist, Rev. John 'Father' Watsford (1820) (pictured), who conducted important work in both Australia and Fiji. It is also 10 years since we shared 'Festival 2010.' Who remembers all the fun of the

Festival? Next year, we will be celebrating the 200th anniversary of the first Chapel and Sunday School on our Parramatta site in 1821 and the 30th anniversaries of the Westmead congregation at Queens Road and the official inauguration of the "Fijian Parish of Parramatta Mission" (Leigh Fijian), in 1991. NB: A 'supplement' providing details of this year's heritage anniversaries, plus some additional insights, is available with this week's newsletter. *In all our PM heritage acknowledgements, we recognise the traditional owners of all the lands on which we gather, honour their history and living culture, and pay our respect to elders past, present and emerging.*

This Sunday the Parramatta congregations are celebrating heritage Sunday. Here is paragraph by Clive Pearson about John Watsford, who was the first Australian born Methodist minister, and who grew up in Parramatta.

The missionary influence of the Parramatta church extends to New Zealand, Tonga and Fiji. John Watsford (whose bust is in the church) served for two spells in Fiji. In the course of the second of those times (1851-1853) he was stationed at Viwa where, along with the Rev. J. Calvert, he was asked to work further on John Hunt's translation of the New Testament into Fijian. He wrote that he 'was at it day after day from early dawn until late at night'. He was assisted by two Fijians (I Taukei) from Bau – Ratu Tevita Koroitukana and Ratu Luke Matanibaba. The Viwa translation was a revised version of the work of Rev John Hunt.

3000 copies were printed and made available in April 1853.

Supplication for Help against Enemies A Prayer of David.

- 1 Incline your ear, O Lord, and answer me,
for I am poor and needy.
 - 2 Preserve my life, for I am devoted to you;
save your servant who trusts in you.

- 3 be gracious to me, O Lord,
for to you do I cry all day long.
 - 4 Gladden the soul of your servant,
for to you, O Lord, I lift up my soul.
 - 5 For you, O Lord, are good and forgiving,
abounding in steadfast love to all who call on you.
 - 6 Give ear, O Lord, to my prayer;
listen to my cry of supplication.

Reflections

The 150 Psalms in the Hebrew scriptures cover the full range of human experience and emotion. Often the emotions are raw, from delight, pain, grief, anger, plea for help. Multiple emotions might be expressed in one Psalm. They express hope and trust in God, even in the most difficult of times. A Psalm can be found for every condition and situation.

The Psalm above is a statement of trust in God. The Psalm has three sections, 1-7 a prayer for help in a time of trouble, 8-13 prayer of thanksgiving, 14-17 returns to the first theme of seeking help and deliverance in a time of trouble. Notice that in verses 1-4, the Psalmist prays for help in a difficult time, then verses 5-7 speaks of God's good and forgiving nature, abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon God. In verse 7 the Psalmist expresses confidence that God will answer this prayer. This leads into the next section, 8-13, of praise of God, who is above all others, like no other gods, and who alone does wondrous deeds. Then, in the midst of this, the Psalmist asks to be taught God's way; to live (walk) in truth and to give an undivided heart to adore God for ever. To sharpen that point, the Psalmist not only prays seeking deliverance from a difficult situation, they also pray to be taught to trust God more fully. The last section of the Psalm returns to the theme of seeking help from those who oppose them, and who have no regard for God. It is difficult to know if during the prayer the Psalmist has received deliverance from those who oppress them, or if that is a hope to come. Also expressed is a desire that those who oppress be put to shame. The psalm ends with a note of strong trust in God.

The Psalmist models for us that we can go to God about every and any situation, of delight or difficulty. The difficulty, hurt, trouble or grief may not be 'fixed' but the relationship with God is strengthened, and the Psalmist is able to face life.

Covid and PM: The pastoral team has been deliberating on when and how a return to in person church might occur. Information has been obtained. Additionally, the construction of the Light Rail in both Parramatta and Westmead is reducing weekend access to our sites. Part of the process will involve the completion of church worship plans, and agreement on the plans from the Church Council. The three congregation leaders' meetings have been separately discussing these matters. The pastoral team will keep everyone informed of progress.

Covid and PM: Each of the PM services is also working on managing the changing situation as restrictions lift. Some of our activities will continue to be by virtual means as the new normal, others will make different decisions depending upon the location and type of service provided. The Executive, Senior Staff, and all staff are continuing to assess and make adjustments.
