PARRAMATTA: CITY WITH A SOUL

The PM Heritage Committee places its support behind benevolent community efforts to save the historic 'Willow Grove' and 'St. George's Terrace' on Phillip Street, Parramatta. A compromise plan to enable new construction on the riverbank and elsewhere, plus preserve these and other important heritage buildings, is being sought. Amid a swathe of impressive new construction, the 'new' Parramatta needs solid connectors to its past that simultaneously provide the townscape with a diverse set of aesthetics and inspirations – in addition to sufficient commercial drawcards: "A city without heritage is a city without a soul."

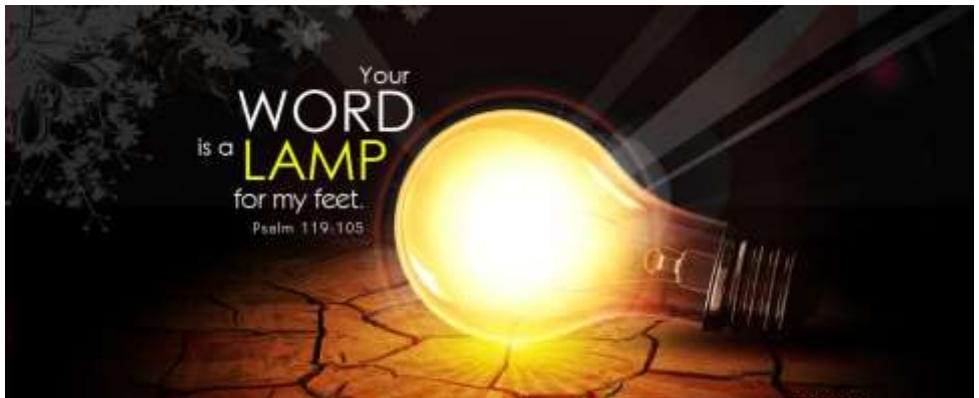

- ¹⁰⁵ Your word is a lamp to my feet
and a light to my path.
- ¹⁰⁶ I have sworn an oath and confirmed it,
to observe your righteous ordinances.
- ¹⁰⁷ I am severely afflicted;
give me life, O LORD, according to your word.
- ¹⁰⁸ Accept my offerings of praise, O LORD,
and teach me your ordinances.
- ¹⁰⁹ I hold my life in my hand continually,
but I do not forget your law.

but I do not stray from your precepts.

Reflection

Psalm 119 is the longest Psalm in the Hebrew Scriptures, at 176 verses! It is written in the form of an alphabetic acrostic consisting of twenty two stanzas, each with eight lines, each of which begins with the letter of the Hebrew alphabet for that stanza. The psalm covers off on all the major themes of the *Torah*, the first five books of the Hebrew Scriptures. The psalmist is showing great devotion to the teaching of God, in which he finds direction and comfort and even happiness. The focus of the verses above is the word of the Lord.

Many congregations would be familiar with the opening words (v. 105) which are often used as a prayer of preparation to hear the scriptures proclaimed in church. The word of the Lord guides the Psalmist. It is a life not always easy. The Psalmist is 'severely afflicted' (v. 107), the wicked have 'laid a snare' for them (v. 110) and they hold their life in their hands all the time, which can be taken to mean that they live a precarious existence in which the daily decisions of every day is potentially life-threatening (v. 109). While written long before COVID 19, it does speak to our situation today. Against these concerns and threats, the psalmist vows continual observance of God's 'law' (vv. 106, 108, 111-112). Most importantly, in facing the difficulties the psalmist is not dependent upon their own efforts and abilities. The psalmist recognises their dependence on the continued blessing of God (vv. 107-8). It is for this reason that the psalmist speaks of God's decrees (teaching, guidance, lore) as the joy of their heart (v. 111). The psalm is a witness to faith and trust in God. This trust is expressed in both going to God in times of difficulty, and the keeping or adherence to God's teaching (ordinance, law, decrees, statutes) in the entirety of life.
