## Psalm 139

1 O Lord, you have searched me out and known me;  
**you know my sitting down and my rising up;**  
**you discern my thoughts from afar.**

2 You mark out my journeys and my resting place  
**and are acquainted with all my ways.**

3 For there is not a word on my tongue,  
but you, O Lord, know it altogether.

4 You encompass me behind and before  
**and lay your hand upon me.**

5 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me,  
**so high that I cannot attain it.**

6 Where can I go then from your spirit?  
**Or where can I flee from your presence?**

7 If I climb up to heaven, you are there;  
**if I make the grave my bed, you are there also.**

8 If I take the wings of the morning  
**and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,**

9 Even there your hand shall lead me,  
**your right hand hold me fast.**

10 If I say, 'Surely the darkness will cover me  
**and the light around me turn to night,'**

11 Even darkness is no darkness with you;  
the night is as clear as the day;  
**darkness and light to you are both alike.**

12 For you yourself created my inmost parts;  
**you knit me together in my mother's womb.**

13 I thank you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made;  
**marvellous are your works, my soul knows well.**

14 My frame was not hidden from you,

**already in your book were all my members written,**

16 As day by day they were fashioned  
**when as yet there was none of them.**

17 How deep are your counsels to me, O God!  
**How great is the sum of them!**

18 If I count them, they are more in number than the sand,  
**and at the end, I am still in your presence.**

19 O that you would slay the wicked, O God,  
**that the bloodthirsty might depart from me!**

20 They speak against you with wicked intent;  
**your enemies take up your name for evil.**

21 Do I not oppose those, O Lord, who oppose you?  
**Do I not abhor those who rise up against you?**

22 I hate them with a perfect hatred;  
**they have become my own enemies also.**

23 Search me out, O God, and know my heart;  
**try me and examine my thoughts.**

24 See if there is any way of wickedness in me  
**and lead me in the way everlasting.**

## Reflections

Jews, Christians and Muslims have much in common. Of course, there are also important distinctions. Additionally, Christians and Jews share the same Hebrew Scriptures, often referred to by Christians as the Old Testament. Psalm 139, from the Hebrew scriptures, expresses the faith of two important aspects of Judaism and Christianity. God is omnipotent. That is God has very great power. God is vast. God is beyond us. Also God is omnipresent. That is God is widespread or constantly encountered. God is present throughout creation, the whole universe everywhere at the same time. The Psalm suggests that God is even in the world of the dead, at the vast reaches of creation and is not hindered by night. God who is vast and beyond our understanding is also close by and concerned for the whole creation and engages with the creation, and even the individual. Psalm 139 underlines the importance of the individual yet not in an individualistic way. It questions the pursuit of individualism and speaks to seeking the best interests of everyone. The Psalm affirms God's intimate knowledge and a personal relationship with God. For the psalmist, this is all wonderful. The psalmist is troubled by the wickedness of others, but in the context of concern about their own relationship with God. The psalmist desires a right relationship with God, and humbly desires to have revealed to them any non-God honouring ways so that they can change or be changed to better live in the right way with God.

In a time of COVID, or in a time of change, the faith of the Psalmist reveals the inherent worth of all people and the closeness of God, and the possibility for God to give encouragement and hope.
