Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

16 Now to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the market places who call to others, 17 and say, "We piped music to you, and you did not dance. We sang songs of grief and you did not mourn". 18 John came and he fasted and drank no wine, and they say, "He has a demon". 19 The Son of man came and he ate and drank and they say, "Look, at this man, he is glutton and wine-drinker, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is justified by her works.

25 At that time Jesus answered and said, "I bless you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you concealed these things from the wise and intelligent and you revealed them to infants; 26 yes Father, because it was well-pleasing before you. 27 All things were delivered to me by my Father, and no one has come to know the Son except the Father, neither has anyone come to know the Father except the Son, and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. 28 Come to me all who grow weary and those who have been burdened and I will refresh you. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, because I am meek and humble in heart and you will find rest for your souls; 30 for my yoke is easy to bear and my burden is light."

Reflection

An authentic life is one marked by consistency between the inner and outer life. It is consistency of intellect and emotions, of intentions and actions. This is not easy. People can truly believe something with their head, but their actions betray their heart.

The verse "Whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple, truly I say to you, on no account will this one lose their reward" (Matthew 10:42), compares with "*We played music, and you did not dance. We sang songs of grief and you did not mourn*". 18 *John came and he fasted and drank no wine, and they say, "He has a demon"*. 19 *The Son of man came and he ate and drank and they say, "Look, at this man, he is glutton and wine-drinker, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!"* Here is a contrast between hospitality and hostility.

We make choices about being open or closed, to be a great listener, or a closed listener, open hearted or closed hearted, open minded or closed minded. Developing the habit of opportunity opens us up to life, to receive and give hospitality.

Matthew 11:28 *Come to me all who grow weary and those who have been burdened and I will refresh you. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, because I am meek and humble in heart and you will find rest for your souls; 30 for my yoke is easy to bear and my burden is light.*” Notice the words *Come . . . take . . . learn . . .* These words address all who feel the weight of burden and stress. Here is the good news of Matthew. All who are weary and tired, yet also of teachable spirit will receive rest and refreshment. Not that it is withheld, but being self-sufficient or closed shuts out the possibility of receiving rest from others and from God.

Indeed, blessed are those who are meek and humble (Matthew 5:5) – having a teachable spirit - for theirs is the reign or kingdom of God. Meekness, humility – a teachable spirit – provides the conditions to know what is real when we see and hear it. It opens the way for authentic living.

Psychosocial Support Program:

In July 2019, the Psychosocial Support Program (PSP) replaced the PHaMs, Partners in Recovery and Day to Day Living (D2DL) programs. Parramatta Mission was delivering those programs in Western Sydney and in the Nepean Blue Mountains (NBM) region. As those programs ended, Parramatta Mission successfully transitioned the consumers to the new PSP program with the aim of providing those consumers continuity of supports with minimal disruption.

There were considerable challenges in winding down programs and implementing new programs concurrently in the first year of operation. The two teams were faced with the task of merging over 150 consumers quickly, completing over 150 intakes and developing comprehensive activities and supports that aligned with the program outcomes with tight timelines. The NBM team, faced enormous challenges with the bushfires and some of the outdoor services had to be redesigned to ensure that consumers remained supported during this challenging period. COVID-19 also tested the creativity of staff who were tasked with providing essential support to consumers in a pandemic environment. Consumers were supported to access new technologies, group activities usually conducted in a physical space are now offered via the internet, and support for consumers testing eligibility for the NDIS did not slow down. Throughout all the challenges of the first year, PSP staff have remained focused on providing a high-quality service to consumers.

Staff have consistently shown that they are ready to overcome any obstacle with their dedication, creativity, and passion for the work that they do.

In 2020/21, the second year of the transition, although Parramatta Mission will continue delivering the PSP service, funding for year 2 of operations has been significantly reduced by the PNHs and this has resulted in smaller teams in the 2 locations. This has meant that some staff member's contracts have come to an end and sadly finished up with Parramatta Mission on 30th June 2020. We thanked the staff for their great work of the past twelve months, and wished them well for the future.

Fundraising Team: Congratulations to our Fundraising Team who in a difficult year increased income by 4%, to \$675,220. This included the highly successful special Meals Plus appeal in March. These funds assist the work of both Meals Plus and Thelma Brown Cottage.

The Pastoral Team: The Pastoral Team continue to monitor the move to in person groups. These discussions are involving the Congregation Leaders meetings. At this stage and for July and August, Sunday worship for our three congregations will continue on zoom. Discussions are underway as to how to have both in-person worship and zoom services when in-person services resume. Noteworthy, the Church Council has responsibility to approve all congregation in-person events and activities. The Presbytery has provided excellent COVID information sessions to assist congregations. The Synod has provided guidelines in line with Government regulations to assist Church Councils in these matters.
