



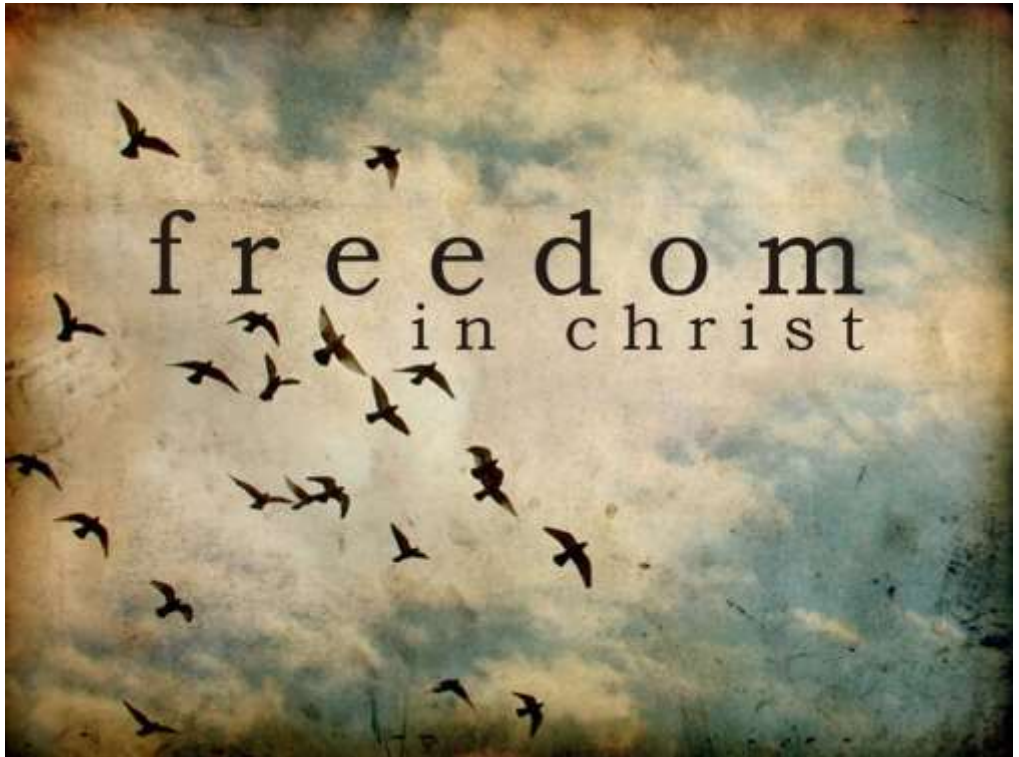

2. **Soqosoqo ni Tabagone (Youth group):** Nomudou sota na ta bagone ena qaravi tiko ena veisiga vakaraubuka kece ena zoom mai na, 7:30 kina 9:00 pm. E na qai tukutuku tale mai o nai talatala Clive ke dua na veisau ni nomudau sota.

Exodus 1:8-2:10

8 Now a new king arose over Egypt, who did not know Joseph. 9 He said to his people, "Look, the Israelite people are more numerous and more powerful than we. 10 Come, let us deal shrewdly with them, or they will increase and, in the event of war, join our enemies and fight against us and escape from the land." 11 Therefore they set taskmasters over them to oppress them with forced labour. They built supply cities, Pithom and Rameses, for Pharaoh. 12 But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread, so that the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites. 13 The Egyptians became ruthless in imposing tasks on the Israelites, 14 and made their lives bitter with hard service in mortar and brick and in every kind of field labour. They were ruthless in all the tasks that they imposed on them. 15 The king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, one of whom was named Shiphrah and the other Puah, 16 "When you act as midwives to the Hebrew women, and see them on the birthstool, if it is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, she shall live." 17 But the midwives feared God; they did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but they let the boys live. 18 So the king of Egypt summoned the midwives and said to them, "Why have you done this, and allowed the boys to live?" 19 The midwives said to Pharaoh, "Because the Hebrew women are not like the Egyptian women; for they are vigorous and give birth before the midwife comes to them." 20 So God dealt well with the midwives; and the people multiplied and became very strong. 21 And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families. 22 Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, "Every boy that is born to the Hebrews you shall throw into the Nile, but you shall let every girl live." 2:1 Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. 2 The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him three months. 3 When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. 4 His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. 5 The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. 6 When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him, "This must be one of the Hebrews' children," she said. 7 Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?" 8 Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Yes." So the girl went and called the child's mother. 9 Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages." So the woman took the child and nursed it. 10 When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, "because," she said, "I drew him out of the water."

(Translation: New Revised Standard Version)

Reflections

What a tale from the Hebrew scriptures! It can speak to us today. Joseph, of the technicolour coat fame, had come from slavery into running the country. Now long after his death and that of the ruler, a new ruler arose who did not know the Joseph story. A good reason for organisations, churches and countries to teach history. The new ruler seems to be both fearful and arrogant. If he had been inquisitive he might have learnt the history. However, out of fear he wants to baby boys put to death. Anxiety and fear always lead to bad decisions. Pharaoh uses coercive force and violence to suppress people. Pharaoh makes a life-threatening command to two mid-wives whose vocation is life-affirming. They put life ahead of death and concoct a story to thwart the intentions of Pharaoh. The boys live. Then Pharaoh happens upon another murderous plan; kill the two year old boys. But one is saved. The amazing thing is that the baby Moses is raised in Pharaoh's house. As an adult Moses will lead his Hebrew people out of captivity and oppression and into another land. The midwives are key characters in this story, and a symbol of life. The central character is God who works out God's plans even through the machinations of human greed, enmity, despotism and violence. There is something to ponder in that for us all.

Conclusion of Ministry Placements and Supply ministry 27 September:

A combined church service will be held on Sunday 27 September to mark the conclusion of the placements of Rev Christine Bayliss Kelly and Rev Dr Manas Ghosh, and the supply ministry of Rev Dr Clive Pearson. The preacher will be Rev Dr Peter Walker, Principal of United Theological College. Zoom details will be sent closer to the time.





The new headspace site in Katoomba – an extension on our headspace in Penrith, is now open. Senator Marise Payne joined with PM staff, people from Wentworth Healthcare (Nepean Blue Mountains Primary Health Network), Mountains Youth Services Team, Gateway Family Services, Platform Youth Services and Katoomba High School to inspect the building. A virtual tour is available on the PM Facebook. headspace is service for young people 12 to 25. The new site is located next to other community services, across the road from a supermarket and around the corner from the high school. The building is on a large site, and plans are underway to activate the backyard, including a large blackboard. Just as at all headspace locations, the local newly formed youth advisory committee provided input into the colours and arrangement of the rooms, and recommendation for the activation of the yard. There is space for a GP, yet to be appointed. It should be borne in mind that the Blue Mountains experienced trauma from the bush fires of 2013 as well as last Summer. Using this office as a base, staff will provide assistance to young people through



a special bushfire relief program across the mountains, as far as Bilpin. Congratulations to all who have made this possible. It is the outcome of more than 6 or 7 years of advocacy and planning.

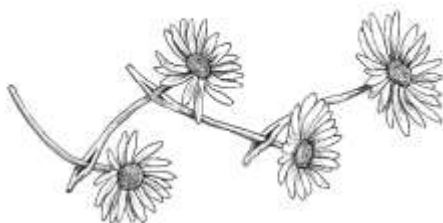

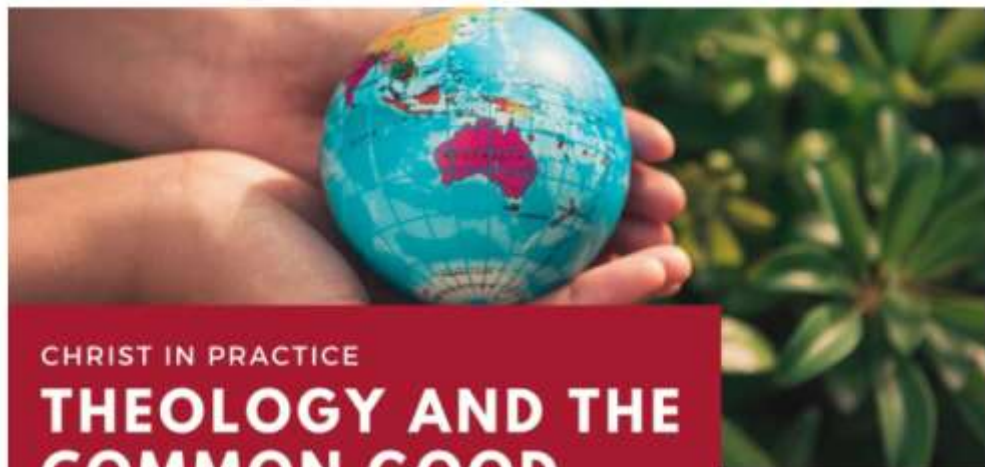
