

# Reflections

The Bible anticipates that a changed relationship with God, and statements of loving our neighbour have practical implications. What happens when we have disagreements? Do we just walk away, or do we struggle to find a new way forward, together? The radicalness of the Christian faith (other faiths as well) is the expectation and the resources to build relationship with people who are different to us, even who have opposing views to us. Ultimately any religion, Christianity included, stands or falls on what happens when under extreme pressure. The Team Australia at the start of the COVID between governments Federal and State, and oppositions, has become messy. How the national cabinet is able to negotiate a way forward that can withstand differences will be crucial to the success or not of that fine initiative. Likewise, in families, communities, workplaces, sporting clubs, churches, all is well when we freely have consensus, but what happens when there is a diversity of views? What about when relationships are damaged? In Matthew Jesus sets out ways to maintain a relationship and, to form a renewed relationship. Elsewhere in Matthew, Jesus says he is with us always to the end of the age, and in this we can draw upon the wisdom of Jesus in our relationships today. Check out some of that wisdom below.

## Matthew 18:15-34

15 Jesus said, "If a brother or sister of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If your sister or brother listens you have regained that one. 16 But if the brother or sister does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every word may be confirmed by two or three witnesses. 17 If the sister or brother refuses to listen to them, tell the church; and if the brother or sister refuses to listen even to the church, let that one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. 21 Then Peter came to Jesus and said, "Lord, how often shall a member of the church sin against me, and I forgive him or her? As many as seven times?" 22 Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times but seventy times seven. 23 The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. 24 And when he began the reckoning, one was brought to him who owed equal to 20 years wages; 25 and as he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, and his wife, and his children, and all that he had, and the payment to be made. 26 So the servant fell down on his knees and implored him saying, 'Be patient with me, and I will repay you everything'. 27 Filled with tenderness, the master of the servant released him, and forgave the loan. 28 But going out that servant found one of his fellow servants who owed him a day's wages; and seizing him by the throat so that he nearly choked him, said, 'Repay what you owe.' 29 So his fellow servant fell down on his knees and pleaded to him saying, 'Be patient with me and I will repay you.' 30 He refused; but he went and threw him into prison until he would repay what was owed.

31 When his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went to their master and explained everything. 32 Then his master called him forward and said to him, 'You evil servant! I forgave all your debt, because you requested me. 33 Shouldn't you also have had mercy on your fellow servant, even as I had mercy on you?' 34 And being angry, his master delivered him to the torturers until he should repay everything owing him. 35 So also your heavenly Father will do to you if you do not each forgive your brother or sister from your heart." ## News

I want to update you with some of the decisions made at the Mission Council (formerly the Church Council) the other night.

Ms Pam Rutledge and Dr Tim Smythe were appointed to the interim board of Parramatta Mission.

Rev Vladimir Korotov was confirmed as the Interim Lead Minister for Parramatta Mission, commencing from when I go on study leave, 6 October, and through to 30 June 2021. Please welcome Vladimir. Vladimir will also be a member of the interim board while I am on leave.

A reminder that I go in study leave, annual leave and long service leave from 6 October 2020 until 21 February 2021, to work on my PHD thesis, which is on parish missions of the Uniting Church. I return for a week, 21-28 February 2021, and conclude my placement at Parramatta Mission on 28 February 2021. At this stage I do not have a placement to go to, however, I am trusting in God's leading over the next months.

The Mission Council also decided to reframe Rev Dr Amelia Koh-Butler's terms of placement. Amelia will, from 1 October, be in a transitional ministry placement until 31 December 2021. Amelia will undertake 15% of her time at Western Sydney University as the chaplain. Along with Rev Dr Clive Pearson, who will be undertaking transitional ministry supply at 50%, Amelia and Clive will work with Vladimir in the transition of the three congregations. While this is due to officially commence from 1 October, with both Rev's Manas and Christine on leave, that work is commencing now.

Note that the closure of ministry placements for Rev Christine Bayliss Kelly and Rev Dr Manas Ghosh, and the end of the current supply ministry of Rev Dr Clive Pearson with the Leigh Fijian Congregation will be on 27 September at 10 am. While a small number of people will gather in-person at the Centre for Ministry, the service will be on zoom. At the conclusion of the service there will be provision for people to interact with all present through the zoom facility.
