

RESPONDING TO THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY

Australia and the Pacific are at the forefront of climate change and its devastating effects.

How do we as Christians begin to grapple with make and sense of this new reality? What are our responsibilities to those who are most impacted (e.g. Pasifika peoples, many in rural areas, poorer communities, wildlife?) How do we begin to understand and unravel the patterns and logics that have led to this crisis (e.g. colonialism, whiteness, neoliberalism)? How can Scripture and Christian theology help to orientate and sustain us?

This subject will include readings and presentations on the climate emergency itself, as well as on theological figures and concepts that can assist with a response. Among other things, readings and presentations will focus on creation, the Anthropocene, ecotheology, Pasifika theologies, and Christian activism.

What is a Public Theology?

There are many different callings that arise out of our response to Jesus' question, 'Who do you say that I am?' Some have to do with our personal journey of faith; some have to do with our life together through worship and pastoral care and outreach.

From its inception, the Uniting Church believed that the Christian life should also address the well-being of society at large and show a concern for neighbours around the world. The discipline of a Public Theology concerns itself with how the Christian faith positions itself in this world beyond our individual selves and the inner life of the church.

A Public Theology takes seriously 'who is your neighbour'? (the parable of the good Samaritan); 'what does it mean to do good to all? (Galatians 6:10); 'as you did to the least of these you did to me' (Matthew 25). It pays particular heed to the saying of Jesus to 'discern the signs of the times' (Luke 12:54-56).

What might these mean for us today? What are the signs of our times?

We have two ways of exploring these themes even in a time of Covid 19. For those who like to read there is a book; for those who like to discuss issues there is an online facilitated workshop, 'Theology for the Common Good' on 22 October 2020 from 10 – 1 pm via Zoom <https://zoom.us/j/4399152776>

Enacting a Public Theology is an anthology edited by Clive Pearson. It is available from Reception [or from Clive] at a cost of \$20. It deals with such diverse things as indigenous Australia, faith and democracy, faith and climate change, the importance of compassion, what is home and how do we belong.

Reflections

This is my last newsletter reflection. My first was for the first week of February 2008! I go on leave from 6 October until 22 February 2021 before concluding my placement at Parramatta Mission on 28 February 2021. I take this opportunity to thank Tracey Taylor who has had the responsibility of producing the newsletter each week. Also, my thanks to Coral Harris who assisted, and produced the newsletter when Tracey has been on leave. I also acknowledge and thank the many people from the three congregations and Korean Faith Community, as well as staff, who have provided regular pages of content. The "Our News" newsletter will continue. Discussions are underway with the new interim pastoral team regarding the reflections, as well as a review of the newsletter.

What follows are some verses from Paul's letter to the church in Philippi. I think there is much that these letters offer to us today.

In chapter 4:4-9, Paul writes:

4 Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say rejoice. 5 Let your gentleness be known to all people. The Lord is near. 6 Be not anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petition with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God. 7 And the peace of God which surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. 8 Finally, sisters and brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovable, whatever is pleasing, if there is any excellence, and if anything worthy of praise, 9 think of these things; which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, practice these; and the God of peace will be with you.

Earlier Paul has spoken of where to place our trust and hope, in God revealed to us as Jesus Christ, and from there comes confidence to face each day. Paul then encourages humility and goes on to speak of the humility of Jesus who did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but humbled himself taking the form of servant as a model for us all. Lastly, Paul encourages the reader to rejoice in all things. This is not to rejoice for those unpleasant things that happen to us, but in them to rejoice for the life in Jesus Christ that gives hope to face any eventuality. Rejoicing in God, developing a disposition of gratitude opens the way to experience life hopefully. I am reminded of a series that Julie did with the congregations that encouraged people to review each day with gratitude; what were the expected and unexpected experiences of the day for which we give gratitude.

Long term readers of this newsletter might recall the series I did on the book by Henri Nouwen, *Reaching out: The three Movements of the Spiritual life*. Nouwen identified the three movements as:

- Loneliness to solitude
- Hostility to hospitality
- Illusion to prayer

These three movements are what Nouwen describes as living a life in the Spirit of Jesus Christ. This movement is dynamic, meaning, we can move between these poles. Reaching out to God begins by acknowledging our situation. Acknowledging our loneliness, our hostilities, our illusions. Having acknowledged our situation, we can reach out to God in prayer and begin the movement from loneliness to solitude, from hostility to hospitality, from illusion to prayer.

Loneliness is endemic. Loneliness can be behind the desire to have constant noise and avoid of silence. Yet it is in silence that we hear the still small voice of God speaking through our sub-conscious minds. We need to move from loneliness to solitude to hear God in the silence. Solitude, which literally means alone, is the place of being comfortable when alone. It is only when we have reached a place of solitude, that we can truly enter into the lives of others.

The movement from hostility to hospitality begins with the acknowledgement that there are some people to whom we are hostile, and there are triggers that can make us hostile.

Our illusions begin with the notion of immortality. We know we are going to die, but we live as if we will live forever and therefore worry about things we cannot control. A hostile word or a rejecting gesture can plunge us into self-complaint or loss of peace. Lonely people often misread the intentions and gestures and words of others. Sentimentality and violence are symptoms of the illusion that our lives belong to us. But our lives do not belong to us; we do not choose the time and place of our birth, nor of our death.

The movement from loneliness to solitude is a gradual conversion from an anxious reaction to a loving response. When hostility is converted into hospitality then fearful strangers can become guests revealing to their hosts the promise they are carrying with them.

Nouwen says that reaching out to God in prayer, in prayer from the heart, is the movement of conversion from illusions to prayer, from loneliness to solitude, from hospitality to hospitality. In this life we will always be prone to illusions, always prone to loneliness, always prone to hostility, and so always need to reach out to God in prayer. Prayer may well start off as of formulaic, but as the people of faith through the centuries have said, keep praying until it becomes prayer of the heart. Prayer is both a gift of God and a work. We keep praying until we receive the gift of prayer. And then keep praying.

News

The Church Council in December 2019 decided to reframe the strategic vision of the past 10 years Parramatta Mission from NSW and ACT wide, to focus on the new vision of the City of Parramatta Local Government Area. In line with that decision, all Parramatta Mission programs outside that area will move to another part of the Uniting Church. Following a review, that means that all the government funded programs, except one chaplaincy, will be transmitted. A discernment process of engagement with Uniting NSW.ACT and Wesley Mission that included briefing sessions and workshops lead to a proposal that management took to the Interim Board and then the Mission Council. The management, and the potential partners were deliberately seeking the mind of Christ in this decision of preferred partner. The Board and the Mission Council likewise. The Mission Council has decided that the preferred partner for the transmission is Wesley Mission, subject to due diligence. The intention is that the due diligence will be undertaken between now and before the end of November. The transmission would occur before the end of April 2021. This work has begun in earnest.

The Mission Council also made other decisions in May, including that the placements of Rev Christine Bayliss Kelly and Rev Dr Manas Ghosh would conclude 30 September.

Rev Dr Amelia Koh-Butler has been redeployed to transitional ministry with the congregations, for 85% of her time, and continuing as the PM interfaith Chaplain at WSU for 15% of her time. This arrangement until 30 December. Rev Dr Clive Pearson has been called to provide 50% transitional supply ministry across the three congregations commencing 1 October until 30 June 2021.

Rev Vladimir Korotkov has been appointed by the Presbytery of Parramatta-Nepean as Interim Lead Minister for Parramatta Mission until 30 June 2021.
