WELCOME

Welcome to the service today.

In October our congregations are participating in the Season of Creation. Season of Creation is a global annual celebration that encourages followers of Jesus to celebrate God’s beautiful Earth, and renew our shared commitment to preserving and restoring that beauty.

During the Season of Creation, we unite as followers of Jesus, celebrating the bonds we share with each other and with “every living creature on Earth.”

Some of today's liturgy and music has been prepared and provided by Common Grace. Common Grace is a growing movement of tens of thousands of Australian Christians passionate about Jesus and Justice. Common Grace invites us to celebrate this season by spending time in prayer, considering ways to inhabit our common home sustainably, and lifting our voices in the public sphere.

This year, the global theme for the season is "A Home for All? Renewing the Oikos of God".

Oikos is the Greek word for "home," or "household". This Season of Creation we reflect on the Oikos of God, a home for all, designed to live and flourish together. A beautiful creation built on diverse, wondrous and complex relationships that support and sustain. However, God's precious creation has been exploited and harmed. Interconnected, life-sustaining relationships have been disconnected, forgotten and denied.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have long walked in the wisdom of these interwoven, interdependent relationships and the need to care for Country, and protect Country, acknowledging the unique role, as Indigenous Christian scholar Randy Woodley¹ expresses, as one part of the "community of creation".

Season of Creation is an opportunity to reflect on the Christian role as stewards of God's beautiful creation and the need for us to renew and restore the Oikos of God as we seek to live out Jesus' call to love our neighbour. As Common Grace CEO and Aboriginal Christian leader Brooke Prentis reminds us, "loving our neighbour means loving our people neighbour, our tree neighbour, plant neighbour, animal neighbour, bird neighbour, fish neighbour, land neighbour, water neighbour, sky neighbour."²

Together we pray for a restoring of right relationship with God and all of creation as we confront the reality of the systems we live in where profit is put before caring for creation, economy before protecting the health of our live-sustaining ecosystems and politics before love for our neighbours.

We pray that we would see clearly the importance of these relationships to the health and flourishing of our Common Home. We pray that we would honor God in the way we treasure and protect God's life-giving gift of creation that sustains, brings joy and heals. We pray that we would restore just relationships with all of God's creation, and as Psalm 96 says, joining our voices with all of creation in singing for joy before the Lord.

SCRIPTURE READING – Genesis 1:1-25

Six Days of Creation and the Sabbath

¹In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

⁶And God said, 'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.' ⁷So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so.

⁸God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

⁹ And God said, 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.' And it was so. ¹⁰God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good.

¹¹Then God said, 'Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.' And it was so. ¹²The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. ¹³And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

¹⁴ And God said, 'Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, ¹⁵and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth.' And it was so.

16 God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. 17 God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, 18 to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. 19 And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

20 And God said, ‘Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.’ 21 So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. 22 God blessed them, saying, ‘Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.’ 23 And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day. 24 And God said, ‘Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.’ And it was so. 25 God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.
