

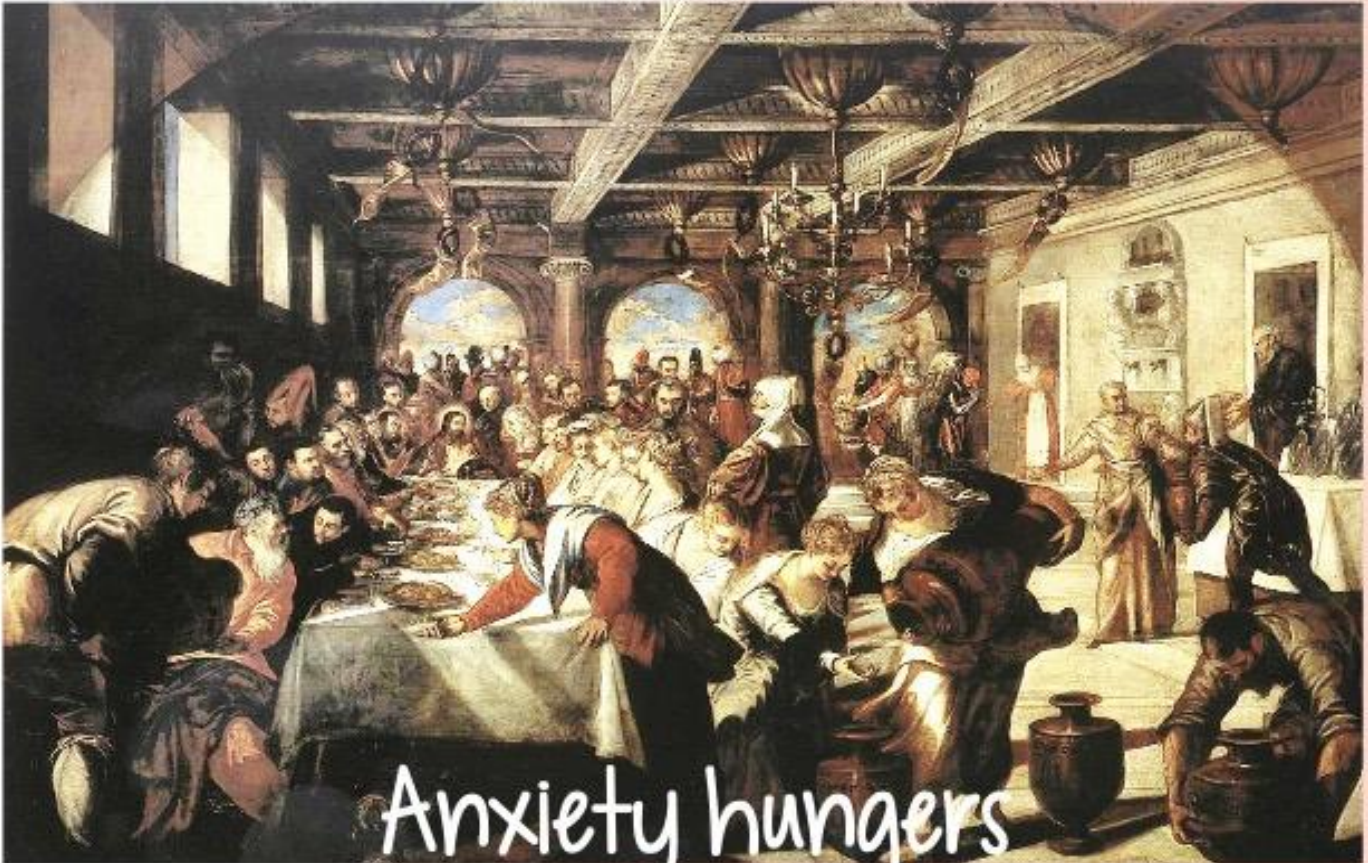

SCRIPTURE READINGS Luke 14:1, 7-13 (Inclusive Text)

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. Jesus then told the guests a parable, having noticed how they picked the places of honour. Jesus said this,

'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour.

'A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this one."

'And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place.

'No, when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, you may hear,

"My friend, move up higher."
