# WEEKLY REFLECTION



Pentecost 16C – Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2022

1 Timothy 6:6-19; Luke 16:19-31

Back in 1973 the English rock band, Pink Floyd released an album called “The Dark Side of the Moon”. One of their feature songs was “Money”, a track which begins with the words:

*“Money, get away, get a good job with more pay and you’re okay.  
Money, it’s a gas, grab that cash with both hands and make a stash”*

“Make a stash” – money is a controversial and often contentious issue. Companies that took significant job keeper wage subsidies during the COVID pandemic while making record profits are case in point. Then there are those other companies whose CEO’s salaries were substantially increased during COVID while receiving generous government subsidies to keep them afloat. And just last week there was a report into a Sydney casino identifying that, in an effort to make substantial profits, there was an alarming degree money laundering, fraud and criminal activity.

*“Money, money, money, must be funny in the rich man’s world”* goes the Abba hit single. This strikes a chord both today and in the past.

Paul, in his first letter to Timothy, raises this matter of money: *“For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil” (1 Timothy 6:10)*. This is a most memorable quote that has become part of our lingua franca ever since.

In 2006 a group of researchers in North America published a paper entitled “The Psychological Consequences of Money” (1).

The paper received extensive media coverage as it involved a series of experiments focussed on people thinking about money without explicitly telling them.

One group was given a task of unscrambling phrases about money while another group received phrases not about money. One group was given piles of Monopoly money and were shown screensavers with various denominations of notes. Another group received items and were exposed to images not related to money.

Researchers found there were distinct resulting behavioural differences between the “money group” and the “non-money group”.

Participants in the “money group” were more reluctant to share their resources, took longer to ask for help when working on various tasks, and were less likely to offer help to others. “Money group” participants were also less likely to reach out to or engage socially with others when compared to the “non-money” group.

It seems money makes people less willing to both seek help and give help. It enhances individualism and diminishes social interaction.

But it's important to note this research is not so much about money as it is about people's response to money. It's not about money intrinsically. Rather, it's about the behaviour that is evoked around the use of money.

This is what Paul is on about in his letter to Timothy:

*<sup>20</sup>For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.*

It's not money in itself, it's about the “love of money”.

The term used here in the New Testament is quite unique. It's a single word literally meaning “love of silver” and this can be best translated as “money-love”. Moreover, this “money-love” points to the kind of behaviour a love of money breeds.

And that is greed. It's an extreme longing for more and more, mostly at the expense of others. It leads to an economy that ultimately breeds “have's” and “have-nots”, wealth and poverty, privilege and bondage, freedom and slavery.

Importantly, as “The Psychological Consequences of Money” shows, “money-love” polarises communities, erodes social engagement and breaks down community solidarity. In Paul's words to Timothy, it “pierces us with many pains”.

Our Gospel reading for this week speaks quite forthrightly about these matters. Lazarus is a destitute man left lying at the gate of a rich person. He is hungry and totally dependent on scraps that fall from the rich person's table. But Lazarus is largely unseen. Even though he lays at the very entrance of the rich person's home where he finally dies, no-one even seems to notice.



In all of this a great "chasm" is created, a gaping hole, a bottomless pit, a deep abyss. And this gulf extends into the after-life as, upon seeing Lazarus at the side of the great ancestor, Abraham, and now experiencing dispossession, isolation and suffering himself, the rich person pleads for mercy.

But the gulf is too wide, the pit is too deep, the abyss is too broad. The rich man is figurately, left to burn in hell!

These are pretty strong words from Jesus, and I believe they need to be taken very seriously. The pursuit of riches and wealth that comes at the expense of the most vulnerable, the accumulation of money that happens on the back of a blatant disregard of the poor and needy, and the yearning for financial benefits that are accumulated as a result of shutting out the disposed and imposing a heavy yoke on those who are impoverished, has dire consequences.

Moreover, this "money-love" screws up priorities, it breaks down relationships and subverts the common good. It literally does "*pierce*" people with many pains".

There is surely a message here for us in a society where the accumulation of wealth is so sought after. As followers of Jesus, we are compelled to ask the question – is there any joy here? And in all of this, what about those people who are silenced at the gate - their voices muted, their welfare neglected, and their needs disregarded?

"Money-love" is a scourge that takes us nowhere. The insatiable drive to "make a stash" is ultimately futile. The prodigious urge to "stockpile a motza" simply says we are fooling ourselves.

The way of Jesus is the way of generosity to others and of service to all. It's never, and it will never be, about the love of money. Paul really puts it in a nutshell as he goes on to say:

*".....do good.....be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for yourselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they you take hold of the life that really is life." (1 Timothy 6:18-19).*

In a world where the love of money seems to be everything, let us truly say "amen" to Paul and his teaching. For this is the way we are called to live.
