## FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

26<sup>th</sup> March 2023



### Rise up....and live!

John 11: 1-44

It is said "big boys don't cry." And you know, this is, to a degree, true. Surveys across many countries show men, when compared to women, are far less likely to shed tears.

But is this always true?

I am, to be honest, prone to be a member of that "stiff upper lip" club. I guess it's part of my English heritage. But there are times when I do want to cry. And it has often happened in response to moving events depicted in the cinema.

Have any of you seen the movie Schindler's List? During World War Two a German industrialist goes to great lengths to preserve the lives of Jewish workers who would otherwise have gone to the gas chambers. But in a very touching scene at the end of the war Oskar Schindler is overcome with guilt at the thought that he could have, if he tried harder, saved more lives. This is a deeply stirring moment.

There is that heartbreaking scene in the movie, Titanic, when that Irish larrikin, Jack Dawson, drowns as his distressed lover, Rose, looks helplessly on.

There is that scene in the movie, Lion, where an Indian boy who is separated from his parents and then adopted by an Australian family, finally meets his mother again after more than twenty years of being apart.

Then for me, one of a most intense, distressing moments comes in the movie, Rabbit Proof Fence, when, back in the 1930's, the official Protector of Australian Aborigines intervenes in the Western Australian town of Jigalong by taking three young girls, Molly, Daisy and Gracie into custody. Their mothers are distraught. They are grief-ridden. They are gutted and broken as their little girls are cruelly whisked away. The absolute heartbreak of these mothers brought me to tears.

And finally, the movie, Sophie's Choice, left me quite desolate. Sophie Zawistowski, played by Meryl Streep, is the daughter of a Polish professor who is involved in protecting Jewish people during the Nazi occupation. Together with her two children, ten-year-old son, Jan, and an eight-year-old daughter, Eva, Sophie is arrested and sent to Auschwitz extermination camp. Here Sophie is protected as she works for a German officer. But there is a catch. She must surrender one of her children to the gas chambers. If she doesn't, then all three of them will be exterminated. Sophie is faced with the most horrendous decision of all – and in doing so, offers up her daughter. The scene is chilling, shocking and horrifying. I did shed more than a tear.

Now, today we witness another man shedding tears. It's a moving, touching moment as Jesus is confronted by the reality and the grief that his friend, Lazarus, has died. Moreover, it is suggested that if Jesus had made it a priority to be there a few days earlier, then Lazarus would still be alive.

This is an intense, dramatic story told beautifully and quite powerfully by the Apostle John. We are told Jesus is "greatly disturbed" after entering the village of Bethany, being met by the grieving Mary and Martha, and then being confronted with the grave of Lazarus.

Some translations of the New Testament tend to tone down Jesus' reaction here by saying he was simply "upset". But most translations pick up on the deep meaning of the text as they declare Jesus is greatly affected. The New King James Version says Jesus "groaned in spirit" while a more contemporary translation called The Message says "a deep anger welled up within him".

A reading of the original Greek, in which this text is written, suggests Jesus really was troubled here. The original text actually suggests Jesus "shuddered with sadness". Jesus "shook with emotion", Jesus "snorted with anger".

Now these are pretty strong reactions.

Then we are told "Jesus began to weep". Here Jesus actually cries. Jesus bursts into tears.

This is significant. So often Jesus is presented in somewhat sanitized, one-dimensional ways, as a figure who is in total control of his emotions and never phased by the stark realities around him. But not so here.

In this story of Lazarus, Jesus is stirred up. He is deeply grieved by the circumstances he faces. Moreover, Jesus is so touched by what happens that a well of anger bursts up in him!

This a very "human" scenario with which many of us can identify. Have you ever felt this way?

Friends, I feel this way when I watch those troubling reports concerning the war in Ukraine. I experience it when I witness the desolation of the Australian landscape as a result of floods and fire. I grieve in the knowledge that some 143 million native animals were impacted in the Blue Mountains bushfires of 2019-20 – many of whom died. I shudder when confronted by the way the gambling industry here in NSW ruins the livelihoods of vulnerable families in Western Sydney.

I am devastated, indeed, angered as I hear, on average, one a woman a month is murdered here in Australia as result of domestic violence while one in five women since the age of 15 have experienced sexual violence. I weep when the drums of war are being beaten over a possible confrontation with China. And I am outraged when national interest and personal gain usurps the needs, the rights and the wellbeing of others.

Friends, Jesus was "greatly disturbed" and "deeply troubled" because his friend Lazarus was dead. Jesus "shuddered with sadness", "shook with emotion" and "snorted with anger" as he witnessed such grief on the faces of Lazarus' sisters, Mary and Martha.

And you know, I believe this tells us something incredibly important about Jesus. For you see, Jesus is vitally attuned to the predicaments we experience in life. Jesus is truly in touch with the frailty, the vulnerability and the angst of what this involves. Jesus is deeply affected by the hurt and the injustice of it all.

So, what does Jesus do?

In midst of darkness and despair, Jesus shines a light. Out of such agony and death, Jesus offers life.

Jesus enters the cemetery, and he faces the tomb. Despite some concern that Lazarus' body is already decomposing, Jesus commands the grave be opened. Then Jesus literally calls Lazarus out with the words "Lazarus, come out!"

The rest of the story is simply stunning. Lazarus comes out. His face and feet are unbound. Life returns to a place of death and decay. Light conquers the deep, mysterious chasms of darkness. The horrible stench of death is thwarted!

Friends the incredible truth being revealed here does not suggest we are free from the traumas, the hurt and the injustices of life. Lazarus did go on to die once again. Jesus' mission is not to keep people from dying. And when you think about it, Jesus did not abolish suffering and death. That's pretty obvious when look around us. We all need hospitals. Palliative care is in increasing demand. And we will all have a funeral!



What's going on here is this:

God, in the person of Jesus is deeply aware of the things of life. God, in the person of Jesus is deeply moved, indeed, God, in the person of Jesus, is deeply affected by what's happening.

God, in the person of Jesus, is upset, greatly disturbed, indeed, God, in the person of Jesus is angered and profoundly shattered by the realities that are exposed all around us.

And this means God doesn't look the other way. Rather, God comes to us in the person of Jesus Christ to pilot us through.

God doesn't retreat into a mystical, holy aura. Rather, God comes to us in the person of Jesus to "talk to the talk" and "walk the walk" - not by-passing, circumnavigating or dodging the things of life. Rather God comes to us in the person of Jesus to penetrate those indestructible brick walls, to show us the way out of those deep black holes and to break through those the insurmountable dead ends.

God does so to open new horizons, to offer new possibilities and to gift us with new ways of being.

Sisters and brothers in Christ, know that this shining light, this death-defying Jesus is present with us always. And because of this, be assured that God wants to be part of our lives. Be heartened that God is gracefully and compassionately involved in this world and all its frailties. Be secure in the knowledge that God is there for each and every one of us.

On this fifth Sunday in Lent our calling is to acknowledge this life-sustaining, death-defying truth. Our challenge is, therefore, to bear witness to it and to live lives that will never succumb to, or give even an inch to, the powers of darkness and oppression that constantly menace us.

Rather in all of this, trust God. Stand firm against every affliction. And in doing so, call those haunting, destructive powers out. Never let them or their stench ever have the last say.

For this is never God's will or God's intention.

Friends, know that God is with you. God is for you. God will never fail you.

Rise up, therefore, and live!

Amen.

Northmead Uniting Church has funding under the Targeted Earlier Intervention Program to employ an Adolescent and Family Counsellor to provide Counselling, Parenting Programs and Education and Skills Training to young people, parents, and families where the young person is experiencing mental health issues and/or is at risk of disengagement from school.

Our current Counsellor is planning to take some extended leave in the second half of this year.

We are looking to recruit a replacement Counsellor to fill this role on a part time basis (19 hours/week) for a period of approximately 25 weeks from 3 July 2023 to 22 December 2023.
