Easter Day – 9th April 2023 Matthew 28:1-10



WHY GALILEE?

The story of that first Easter day is told in different ways according to the four Gospels. Mark's Gospel confronts us with an empty tomb. Luke also leaves us with an empty tomb but on that same day Jesus reveals himself in a most dramatic way to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. John's Gospel is more touching as Mary Magdalene, in a very tender, intimate moment, encounters the risen Christ in the garden.

Matthew's account is quite striking. The ground shakes and there are flashes of lightning as the women are confronted with a heavenly angel and then with the risen Christ himself.

Reading these four accounts of that first Easter day is quite interesting and I do not see any real conflict here. For this most remarkable, dramatic, electrifying story of Easter is told by these four Gospel writers from their own particular perspectives. The story is told from their own particular, dazzling experiences, none of which were necessarily the same.

Mark leaves us in awe, simply wondering. John's account focuses on personal, tender encounters with Jesus. Luke confines the whole story to the bustling city of Jerusalem while Matthew, especially, makes the point that it is in the region of Galilee, and not Jerusalem, where the impact of Jesus' resurrection really hits the road.

"He is going ahead of you to Galilee" the women are told in Matthew's Gospel as they gaze into the empty tomb.

"Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me" says the risen Jesus as he meets the women on their way home.

"Galilee" – in the midst of this Easter drama why does Galilee come into play? Why does Jesus go ahead of them to Galilee?

What's so significant about Galilee?

Well, Galilee was very much a regional centre. It was far from the centre of power in Jerusalem where the autocrats, the bureaucrats, the lobbyists and the fat cats lived.

Galilee was a region characterised by ethnic diversity. Moreover, most of the population were tenant farmers, peasants who barely survived after returning huge proportions of their harvest to their landlords and then paying huge taxes their Roman occupiers.

Galilee was also a region with a long-recorded history of unrest. In Jesus' day insurrections and revolts were common. These were brutally put down by the military who took no prisoners.

And Galilee was sometimes referred to as the "Galilee of the Nations", the "Galilee of the Gentiles" or the "circle of heathens". This is because Galilee was influenced by outside forces who were seen to undermine the "purity" of Israel's faith and tradition.

So, you see, Galilee was a cosmopolitan and often controversial place. It was largely poor. The people could be pretty rough and volatile while most of population lived under a regime that afforded them little freedom or dignity.

Friends, this is why Galilee and Jesus' return to Galilee is important. For, when you think about it, Galilee pretty much typifies what much of the world is like. Galilee embodies how most people around the world live and what they experience in life.

There is no mistake here. The risen Jesus chooses Galilee to reveal himself. Galilee is chosen as the place where the reality of resurrection is declared and takes root. And Galilee is chosen because this is the kind of place God chooses to reach out to. This is the kind of place where God's heart lies. This is the kind of place in which resurrection speaks most profoundly.

And this is the kind of place where we are called to be the church and minister today.

Secondly, Galilee is significant for another reason.

As I reflected on this matter it occurred to me that Jesus, now risen from the dead, actually returns to origins here.

Jesus' earthly ministry began in Galilee. This where Jesus largely healed and taught. This where Jesus called his disciples and commissioned them to be apostles. This is where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. This is where Jesus first spoke about the in-breaking kingdom of God's grace, mercy, justice and peace.

In returning to Galilee, to the place where it all started, I believe Jesus is inviting us to return to our "origins" to re-read the story, to re-experience all that Jesus offered during his earthly ministry - and to do so in the light of his resurrection which declares - light overcomes darkness, life triumphs over death, hope stifles despair, good vanquishes evil, love conquers all.

This is to see and experience the story, this is to re-focus our faith through the lens of resurrection. This is to identify resurrection as the reference point, the fulcrum around which everything we understand and do as Christians revolves. This is to place the resurrection at the very heart of things as we bear witness to the story of Jesus and as we are called to be the church today.

As I pondered these matters in more depth, I realised there is a lot to this. Resurrection faith means Jesus is not just a hero from the past. The ministry of Jesus is not simply an event confined to the annals of ancient history. Rather, in his resurrection, Jesus becomes a living reality. Jesus becomes a constant empowering presence that re-shapes, re-forms and indeed, transforms, lives even today.

It also occurs to me that resurrection is not just a happy ending to a tragic story. We could easily see it that way. But resurrection is much more than this. Resurrection involves moving on by seeing things in a different way. Resurrection marks the beginning of something vital and fresh by offering radically new possibilities.

I believe resurrection takes the story of Jesus up a notch. It does so by claiming resurrection is much more than an event locked into the past. It means resurrection doesn't have to stand or fall on the basis of empirical evidence or the need to prove it in a court of law. Moreover, resurrection doesn't have to be contained or held captive by narrow dogmatic statements.

Rather, resurrection is a profound reality to be embraced. Resurrection is a mind-boggling truth to be lived - right now!

So, why Galilee?

Firstly, Galilee mirrors the kind of world so many people experience. And this means resurrection is for the world. Resurrection is for the whole world. Resurrection is for everyone. Resurrection is for you and for me.

Why Galilee?

Secondly, the risen Jesus' return to Galilee invites us to go back and re-read the story where-ever we are. Jesus' return to Galilee challenges us to re-experience the faith, not through a blind adherence to historical events or by signing up to narrow dogmatic statements, but through the transforming, renewing, life-giving reality of Jesus who, in his resurrected power, is present with us now.

Why Galilee?

Friends, Galilee is an important metaphor for life. Galilee is a significant embodiment of what it means to follow Jesus today.

So, be open to the truth that Easter is a day for all people. Easter is a day that impacts on the whole world. Easter engages with people in the midst of their lives, unremarkable or challenging, hopeless or hopeful, bad or good, loveless or love-filled, they may be.

And be assured, resurrection is not a historical legacy from the past. On this day we don't simply remember or commemorate the resurrection of Jesus – we are invited to experience it!

We are beckoned to allow it to re-focus and re-shape how we see things. We are summoned to enable it to re-form and transform the way we do things.

For resurrection cuts to very essence of who we are. Light overcomes darkness, life triumphs over death, hope stifles despair, good vanquishes evil and love conquers all.

Resurrection is a way of life, it's a way of being - right now!


