REFLECTION: WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2024

The World Day of Prayer is coming up soon, on **1 March 2024**. For decades this global prayer service represents local churches participating in an ecumenical global movement to come together to pray, focusing on a particular theme and place in the world and supporting a shared project. This year our resources have been prepared by **Christian Palestinian Christian women in Ramallah**.



The Worship Service shares stories of three generations of Palestinian women. The art work by Halima Aziz depicts the three women sitting under an olive tree. Olive trees are very important in Palestine and can live for a very long time. Some olive trees in Palestine today were there during the time of Jesus. They are a symbol of abundant life and fruitfulness. The Palestinian Christian women who wrote this worship service invite us to join them in praying for peace, justice and freedom. They call us to treat all with justice and love, and confess our collective role in the environmental crisis facing our world – but to not give up hope and to commit to the task of repairing what has been damaged or destroyed.

This theme and resources were prepared before the current crisis in the Holy Land, so it is a privilege to have stories and prayers written by women from Palestine who know suffering and hardship. They call us to ***'Bear With One Another in Love'***. Included in the worship materials is a Bible Study and background about the situation in Palestine as well as music resources.

In preparation you might like to listen to the Lord's prayer sung in Aramaic or the beautiful and haunting Arabic refrain, ***Yarabba ssalami*** (**God of peace and justice rain down upon us your peace**) which I learnt last year when I was in Bethlehem.

Matters agreed included:

Legal Advice

In November 2023, we sought advice in relation to whether the governance of the PBI under the PM Board could be made a responsibility of the PCUC Council.

All present were asked to provide feedback & there was overall consensus on having a separate Board with community involvement. To assist in addressing possible conflict of interest, it was considered the Board & Council Chairpersons should not be the same person & it was not necessary for all Council members to be also part of the Board. The Council also requested David Norris to develop a conflict of interest policy

Manse – 4 Wyoming Avenue Oatlands

Following approval of the placement of Rev Tui Waqanibaravi as Resource Minister, we requested our Property Manager to give notice to the tenants of our Wyoming Avenue property so we could use as a Manse. The property will become available no later than 14 March 2024.

Membership of Presbytery

We are seeking one or two members to represent PCUC at Presbytery. Should anyone be interested please speak with one of your Church Council members.

Fellowship Centre Upgrade Concept Design

In mid-January we received a copy of the concept design for the upgrade of the Fellowship Centre that was discussed at the inSpire Parramatta Development Control Group (DCG). The DCG requested the PCUC Council to review & endorse the concept plan. The intention is to tender the works in February with the intention of works commencing in March.

In reviewing the Fellowship Centre upgrade concept plan the PCUC Council members were asked to consider the following:

- * Due to its intended redevelopment no maintenance or upgrade works have been undertaken on the Fellowship Centre for many years. This has resulted in the condition of the premises for the delivery of Meals Plus and other services being at a standard well below what it should be.
- * Redevelopment of the property has been further delayed by a range of factors including changes to planning controls. It is likely that the existing Fellowship Centre premises will need to be used for approximately a further 5 years.
- * The upgrade is a temporary solution, with new premises ultimately to be provided in a redevelopment of the Fellowship Centre and/or Epworth sites. Costs of the upgrade works therefore should be reasonably minimised.
- * The upgrade works are intended to be as Exempt Development. In principle the simplest way to understand this is that the proposed works are concerned with maintaining and repairing the existing building, rather than making any material changes (which would require a DA and trigger additional obligations and costs).
- * The upgrade concept design is based on a design brief that was developed over the latter part of last year with input from Parramatta Mission, Leigh Memorial Church congregations, the Meals Plus service and history/heritage considerations.
- * The concept plan is a work in progress and is subject to ongoing refinement.
- * The proposed upgrade works including costs will form part of the overall inSpire project budget, and be undertaken and managed by Synod's inSpire project team.

- Church Council resolved to:
- i. receive the report
 - ii. endorse the decision to tender the works in February with the intention of works
 - iii. commencing in March subject to office accommodation being restricted to Level 1.
 - iv. request feedback from Congregation Leadership Team by no later than 14 February 2024
 - v. request Ian Gray & David Norris to provide feedback at a Leigh Memorial & Leigh Fijian worship service

Israel Pilgrim Tour – September 2023

The prospect of travelling to Israel had been a lifetime dream, or what I referred to as ‘the Holy Land.’ Since 1977, Fijian soldiers were deployed as peace keepers by the United Nations, and over time pilgrimage tours were operational. Families of deployed soldiers had some sense of connection, especially the ones that had lost their loved ones there – they would be referred to as *kacikaci ni cagi* (“they have become wind in foreign land”). Recounts of events by those that travelled kept me drawn to the likelihood of a visit. My late mother had the privilege to visit one of the Fiji based UN camps years ago and toured biblical sites. It kept me hoping, to physically walk where Jesus walked. The opportunity to join what was originally called the Canterbury Women’s Israel Pilgrimage was offered to the Fijian women’s group at Parramatta. Six of us took up the offer, together we were a group of 20; Uniting Church, Adventist, Pentecostal and of non-practising religion background; all women except for a brave-heart gentleman, an elder and chief from Fiji Parish, Sydney Presbytery. We departed Sydney on the morning of 26 September 2023 for a 22 hour flight. One of the ladies travelled from America and met us on the Dubai-Tel Aviv leg.

Sukkot: One of the main events of the pilgrimage was the Feast of Tabernacles known as *Sukkot*, organised by International Christian Embassy Jerusalem (ICEJ). It’s a week-long Jewish holiday to commemorate God’s overarching plan in releasing them from Egyptian slavery, and their 40 years of wandering in the desert to the Promised land. For the first couple of nights, we joined thousands of pilgrims in a intercultural event represented by nearly 80 nations, praising and worshipping along the Sea of Galilee. For the rest of the *Sukkot* program we made our way to Jerusalem and the remaining nights the feast was celebrated at the Pais Arena. The uplifting atmosphere can be described as a spiritual experience that had set the tone for our tour. Apart from that, we visited historical sites including Caesaria, the city of Herod the Great, Rosh Hanikarah with its cave tunnels with rail tracks that linked Cairo – Haifa – Beirut during the war; Tzipori – an archaeological site with mosaic designs that defined different settlement times; and the wonder of the Keshet Cave. We toured biblical sites; Mount Tabor known as the Mount of Transfiguration; a preserved community in Nazareth Village; Magdala - known as the town of Mary Magdala; Mount of Beatitudes overlooking the Sea of Galilee; sailing on a wooden boat across the Sea of Galilee – on one side of the boat the evening sun was setting and on the other the moon rising; at the other side of the lake we dined on a platter of the spoils of the Sea of Galilee; we experienced baptism at River Jordan; Mount of Olives at the Garden of Gethsemane; Western Wall to pray, meditate and insert a handful of prayer requests between cracks in the Wall; we walked along Via Delarosa at the different stations of the cross; sang in the Upper Room; and shared dinner at the home of the Lone Soldiers to end *Sukkot*. In most of these places we sat and sang and prayed, and felt the presence of the Spirit within and around us.

To Jordan: On the 12th day of our stay, the morning of Saturday 7th (Sabbath), *Sukkot* had closed and we left Jerusalem to travel to Jordan for a 2 day tour. It was only when we reached the border and were refused entry, that we realised the horrific events that had unfolded in Israel. We had to return to Jerusalem. For the next couple of days we were locked down in Jerusalem hearing sirens, gazing to the sky to see trails of clouds from missiles, and the frequent chiming of the app that indicated where missiles landed – a few times about 20 or 30 km away, sometimes further. We huddled together in a small room in the basement of our hotel in prayers and fellowship. What was happening was beyond our understanding, control and experience.

The Wrestle: It was in the lockdown that I had time to pause, read, and have a glimpse of the complexity of politics on this side of the world. The brief conversations with a few prior to our departure slowly made some sense. The conversations with the Jordanian workers in the hotel that commute monthly from Jordan to Jerusalem; the fear in the face of our driver Mohammed; emerging stories of the West Bank and Gaza; the lives of those lost on the 7/10; lives and livelihood decimated by the retaliation force shifting the attack to the civilians of Gaza. For me, it continues to be an ongoing wrestle in terms of my memories – between the earlier experience of abundant spirituality, of worship and praise, of holiness and heavenly realms – and the realities of what I may have been too blinded to see, ie. the erected walls of the West Bank, repossessions of family homes; restricted water supplies to many, breach of humanitarian privileges; and the continuing bombing and decimation of homes and civilians in the Gaza strip. As I end this piece, I am reminded of the story along the Sea of Galilee where Jesus had responded to the three-fold declaration of love from Peter, ‘feed my sheep’ (John 21:17). It is the story of forgiveness, reassurance, reconciliation and hope. Modern day Israel is the land where God had displayed His love for humanity, not only to a chosen people, but to humanity and creation as a whole. It would be helpful for us to intently listen and respond to God asking us ‘Do you love me.’ And maybe like Peter, we need to be asked three times, and be reminded that Jesus too did a three-fold response of ‘feed my sheep’ reiterating that it is about *others*, and not ourselves.
